CARELESSNESS CUTS BATTERY EFFICIENCY DOWN TO TWO-THIRDS

"Battery manufacturers estimate that the average car owner gets about two-thirds of the service and life of which his battery is capable," says Mr. Carpenter, north shore Willard service station dealer.

One of the reasons for this, according to Mr. Carpenter, is that the owner does not form regular habits with regard to battery care. He will, for instance, add water every week just as directions say as long as his car is new. But after he has been driving his car a while, he begins to slip and adds it only every two

weeks or every three weeks, or perhaps lets the battery go a month without attention.

Fortunately a battery will stand an enormous amount of this neglect before the effects begin to show, but they are sure to become apparent after a while.

The only way to keep any battery in shape to give all the service it is capable of, is to add water at regular intervals just as long as you own

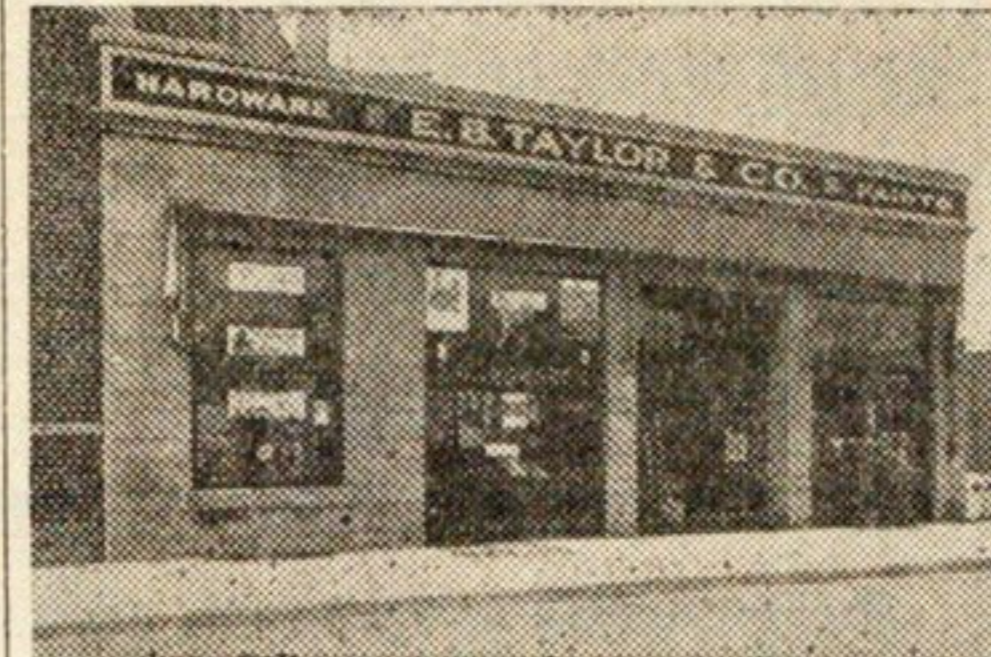
your car. Then if you make hydro-meter tests regularly, be sure that you are keeping the charge up where it ought to be. If you go to the battery service station the minute anything seems to be wrong, you can be fairly sure that your battery won't do the unexpected thing and go back on you just when you need it most. Moreover, you can be certain that you are giving it the sort of treatment necessary to prolong its life.
