

## "REILLY'S BUCKS" IN FIRST ANNUAL REUNION

North Shore Fighters Attend Session of Rainbow Veterans on Anniversary of Initial Battle

Several local fighters were on hand when "Reilly's Bucks" gathered Monday evening in the Auditorium hotel in Chicago, for the first meeting of the Illinois chapter of the Rainbow division veterans. The smoker celebrated the first anniversary of the 149th field artillery's first participation in a major operation. A year ago Monday night the artillery began operations in the Champagne sector and aided in winning the Champagne battle that had been advertised in Germany as their "peace offensive."

General approval marked the adoption of what will be the official insignia of the Illinois chapter. The button chosen will be a spread eagle with a rainbow across between the tip of the wings and the numerals "42" over the eagle's head.

### Col. Reilly Tells Plans

Col. Henry J. Reilly, who is president of the state chapter, announced that plans were under way to reorganize the old artillery band, consisting of seventy-five pieces. The membership of the Illinois branch totals over 700. A drive was launched to bring the membership above 1,000.

It was also announced that with opening of permanent headquarters at 52 East Adams street, active work would be started in compiling historical data of the regiment. The headquarters will maintain a bureau for military information.

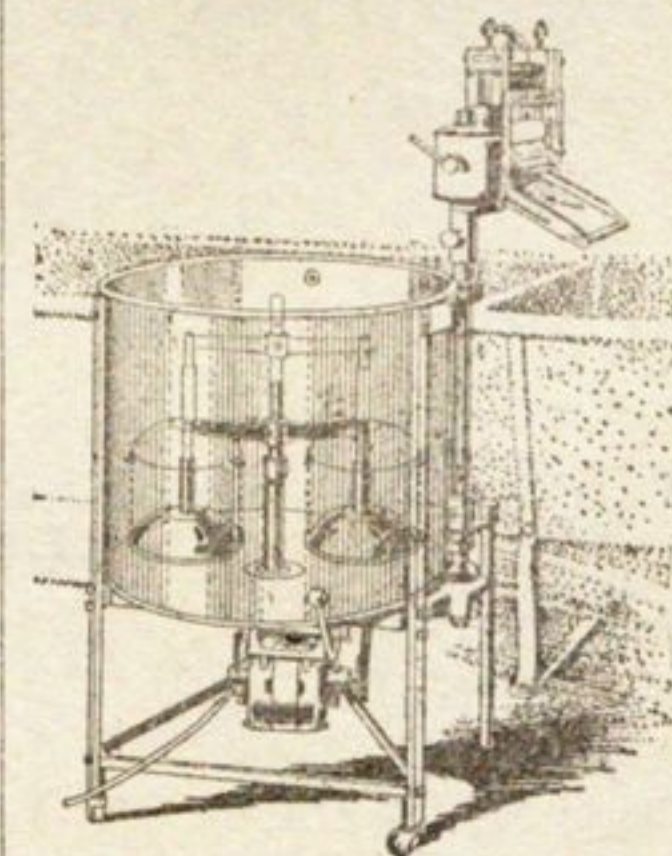
