## HEALTH CENTER OPENS CLASSES FOR MOTHERS

"Little Mothers' League" is Organized At Gross Point Health Center for North Shore Women

### IS BABIES' YEAR VENTURE

Free Instruction In Care of Homes and Children Afforded Mothers and Older Girls of Village

The Gross Point Health Center on Ridge avenue, near Wilmette avenue, issues a standing invitation to mothers of the north shore to bring their babies and younger children to the Infant Welfare Clinic at the Center, open every Wednesday afternoon.

This is children's year throughout the United States and a special campaign is being conducted impressing upon mothers the imperative necessity of affording the babies the best chance along the road of health.

#### All For Babies

Better babies means bigger success and a stronger, more virile people. The best is not to much nor to good. Is your baby growing properly? Do you know?

Each Wednesday afternoon, from 2 to 5 o'clock, the Infant Welfare Clinic is open to all. There are two doctors, as well as a registered graduate nurse, ready to give assistance and sound advice relative to the health of your child. Consultation and advice are positively free of charge.

#### Hostess Entertains

The Parent-Teacher League also has a hostess at the Health Center each week to meet the mothers and make the afternoon visit a pleasant and comfortable affair.

North shore mothers, other women and older girls will be much interested in the "Little Mothers' League" established at the Health Center. We want to begin our class work on Thursday afternoon. Come to the Health Center at 2 o'clock and join. We are going to learn many useful things. The nurse will be glad to meet all mothers and particularly young women of the north shore who are interested in this venture. We need your suggestions and ask your assistance. There will be no charges for these classes.

The Traveling Health Clinic is coming to the Health Center at 10 o'clock, Thursday, July 24. The Clinic was equipped and is maintained, through the sales of Red Cross Christmas seals, by the Chicago Tuberculosis Institute. All women of the north shore are invited to inspect this remarkable hospital on wheels.

### HEADS OF VILLAGES INSPECT ROAD WORK

President Zipf reported to the Village Board this week the result of an investigation tour of township roads, with officials of other north shore villages.

Highway Commissioner H. H. Sherer headed the expedition, pointing out road improvements already completed or underway as well as prospective work on township highways. Necessary improvements to be undertaken as funds become available were explained to the officials.

Prospects indicate that within two years New Trier township will boast 100 per cent road improvement, it was said.

Commissioner Sherer, as emphasized by President Zipf, is achieving 100 per cent results at 50 per cent of the former cost of road improvement in the face of greatly increased cost of materials and labor.

### OTTONE HELD TO GRAND JURY ON LARCENY CHARGE

Albert Ottone, Wilmette motorcycle policeman recently discharged by Village authorities because of alleged conduct unbecoming a police officer, was held to the Grand Jury Wednesday afternoon by Justice of the Peace John F. Boyer, of Evanston, charged with larceny. Ottone was released on \$300 bonds pending the hearing by the Grand Jury.

Ottone, two weeks ago, was accused of the theft of a spare tire from a machine left stranded in a vacant lot near the Wilmette north limits. The complainant, B. F. Marthens, of Evanston, demanded Ottone's arrest following a personal investigation in which he was said to have found the missing tire on a machine, owned by Ottone, stored at the Terminal garage at Fourth street and Linden avenue.

Ottone was discharged at the Tuesday meeting of the Wilmette Board of Trustees, following his suspension two weeks ago by Village President Edward Zipf.

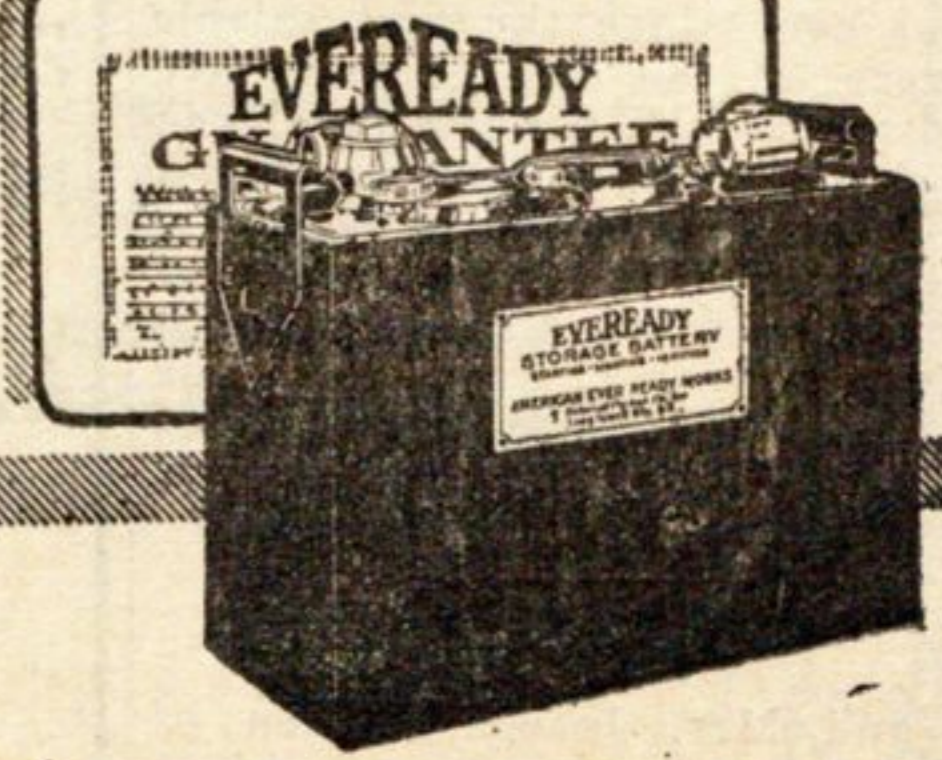
