

"CONSTITUTION DAY" SET FOR SEPT. 17

Every City and Village in the United States Asked To Celebrate National Event

To combat Bolshevism and other un-American influences, curb the spirit of unrest evidenced in the riots, strikes and general disorder now prevalent in Chicago and other sections of the country, a nationwide campaign of education has been started by the National Security League and other patriotic bodies, and many of the most influential men and women to give to the people of the United States a better understanding of the national constitution and American institutions. This great movement is to culminate in a nationwide celebration of the birthday of the constitution on September 17, to be known as "Constitution Day." Celebrations will be held in every city, town and hamlet in the country.

Each state has a director in charge of the campaign. For Illinois the chairman is Andrew Rothwell Sheriff, the Chicago lawyer, with Governor Frank O. Lowden as honorary chairman. In emphasizing the importance of this campaign chairman Sheriff pointed to the riots and general spirit of disorder now prevailing in Chicago.

"The present conditions of disorder in Chicago are much more than casual; much too serious to be borne in the ordinary course of community affairs. No national excuse can be found for race conflicts under the just and equitable principles of our government, conceived for the protection of each individual and the welfare of all.

"No sentiment of community responsibility can be found in a street car strike which refuses an increase of more than fifty per cent in wages and stops the circulating system of the city because of demand for an immediate increase of about eighty per cent cannot be met.

"If the participants in these breaches of civic order know that by their membership in the community they are under fair obligations to their fellow citizens which are clearly defined in our constitution and laws; if they had learned these sound principles of common intercourse in their childhood, and developed respect for them with years, such occurrences as these in our midst today would be reduced to the minimum.

"It is to bring about these better conditions of popular under standing of respect and mutual security that the patriotic societies of the country are setting out in this campaign of enlightenment leading up to the celebration of 'Constitution Day.' This, we hope, will arouse renewed interest in our essential principles of government and more general observance of them as a permanent and growing sentiment in all our people for the future."

Associated with the National Security League in this campaign are such organizations as the National Association of Constitutional Government, of which David Jayne Hill is the chairman; Sons of the American Revolution, American Rights League, American Defense Society, Boy Scouts of America, Illinois State Bar Association, County and Probate

Judges Association of Illinois, Illinois Branch of the D. A. R., Founders of America, and many other civic organizations.

Chairman Sheriff of Illinois has started to organize the campaign for this state. Lee E. Ranck, of the Liberty Loan Speakers' Bureau, has been appointed Director of arrangements and H. M. Byllesby, treasurer. The campaign headquarters is at 105 West Monroe street, Chicago. It is planned to carry the campaign into the colleges, high schools, grade schools, labor organizations, churches, commercial associations teachers institutions, county fairs, public parks and all other places where the people can be addressed.
