

ISSUE NOTICE TO 4% COUPON LIBERTY LOAN BOND HOLDERS

The following notice relative to conversion and exchange of 4 per cent Coupon Liberty Loan Bonds has been issued by the United States Treasury to all banks and trust companies in the United States:

Your attention is specifically called to the following features:

The last coupon on 4 per cent Second Liberty Loan bonds is due on November 15, 1919.

The last coupon on 4 per cent First Liberty Loan Converted bonds is due December 15, 1919.

Holders of such 4 per cent Coupon bonds are urgently requested to convert them into bonds bearing 4 1/2 per cent interest before November 15, 1919, in the case of the Second Liberty Loan, or December 15, 1919, in the case of the First Liberty Loan converted, and thus eliminate an awkward interest adjustment.

Four per cent bonds converted after November 15, in the case of the Second Liberty Loan, or December 15, in the case of the First Liberty Loan converted, will, in accordance with the extended conversion privilege, be affected as of the next semi-annual interest payment dates, i. e. May 15 or June 15, 1920. As these are no coupons attached to the bonds covering interest to those dates, it will be necessary for the Treasury department to remit to the holders of such 4 per cent bonds a special coupon or check representing interest to May 15 or June 15, 1920, as the case may be.

There will be no definite 4 per cent coupons ready for delivery before March, 1920, and unless specifically stated to the contrary, all 4 per cent bonds received by us will be deemed to have been surrendered for conversion into 4 1/2 bonds.

Four and one-half per cent First Liberty Loan converted and 4 1/4 per cent Second Liberty Loan converted definite bonds will be available for delivery on or about March 15, 1920.

Unless holders of 4 per cent bonds present them to us for conversion before November 15 or December 15, 1919, they should be held until such time as the definite bonds are ready for delivery.

It is suggested that holders of 4 per cent Coupon bonds who do not care to convert, be urged to exchange them for registered bonds which are in permanent form.

Forms for your use in submitting 4 per cent bonds to be exchanged for definite 4 per cent bonds in both coupon and registered form will be furnished later.

MAGNETO-IGNITION CARS WIN AT SHEEPSHEAD BAY

So far, this has been a great year for records by magneto-ignition racing cars. This season has just closed with another big victory at the Sheepshead Bay two-mile track, where Gaston Chevrolet, the French-American driver, hurled his magneto-equipped Frontenac car across the finishing line and established a new world's record for the 150 miles distance. His time, 1 hour, 22 minutes, 34 1/5 seconds, beat the old record held by Ralph Mulford by more than three and a half minutes. Mulford's record was 1 hour, 26 minutes 14 1/10 seconds.

Gaston's brother, Louis Chevrolet, also in a magneto-ignition Frontenac, won the thirty-mile race, crossing the line first in two of the three ten-mile heats. He was second in the other. In the 150-mile event Louis, after racing 110 miles almost wheel to wheel with his brother Gaston, was compelled to quit as he and his mechanic were painfully burned about the hands and legs through his car catching fire. The car was totally destroyed.

Ralph Mulford in his magneto-equipped Duzenberg won the second heat in the thirty-mile Invitation Match race, run in three heats of ten miles each, but met with an accident in the third heat which nearly ended his career. His front tire blew out while he was speeding at two miles a minute. His car skidded into a stone abutment but neither he nor his mechanic were seriously injured.

Joe Boyer was second in the thirty-mile result, and was also second in the 150-mile event, his time, 1:23:43 3/5, being better than Mulford's previous World record.

Ralph de Palma, the popular idol, and all other drivers of battery-classed in the day's events. Ralph

ignition cars were hopelessly out-having lost several of the big national racing events of the summer to the more reliable magneto-ignition cars, had hoped to retrieve his laurels on this occasion. He only finished third in one of the ten-mile heats and was seventh in the 150-mile event.

The afternoon was ideal for racing, with little wind. About 30,000 enthusiastic spectators were in the huge stands.

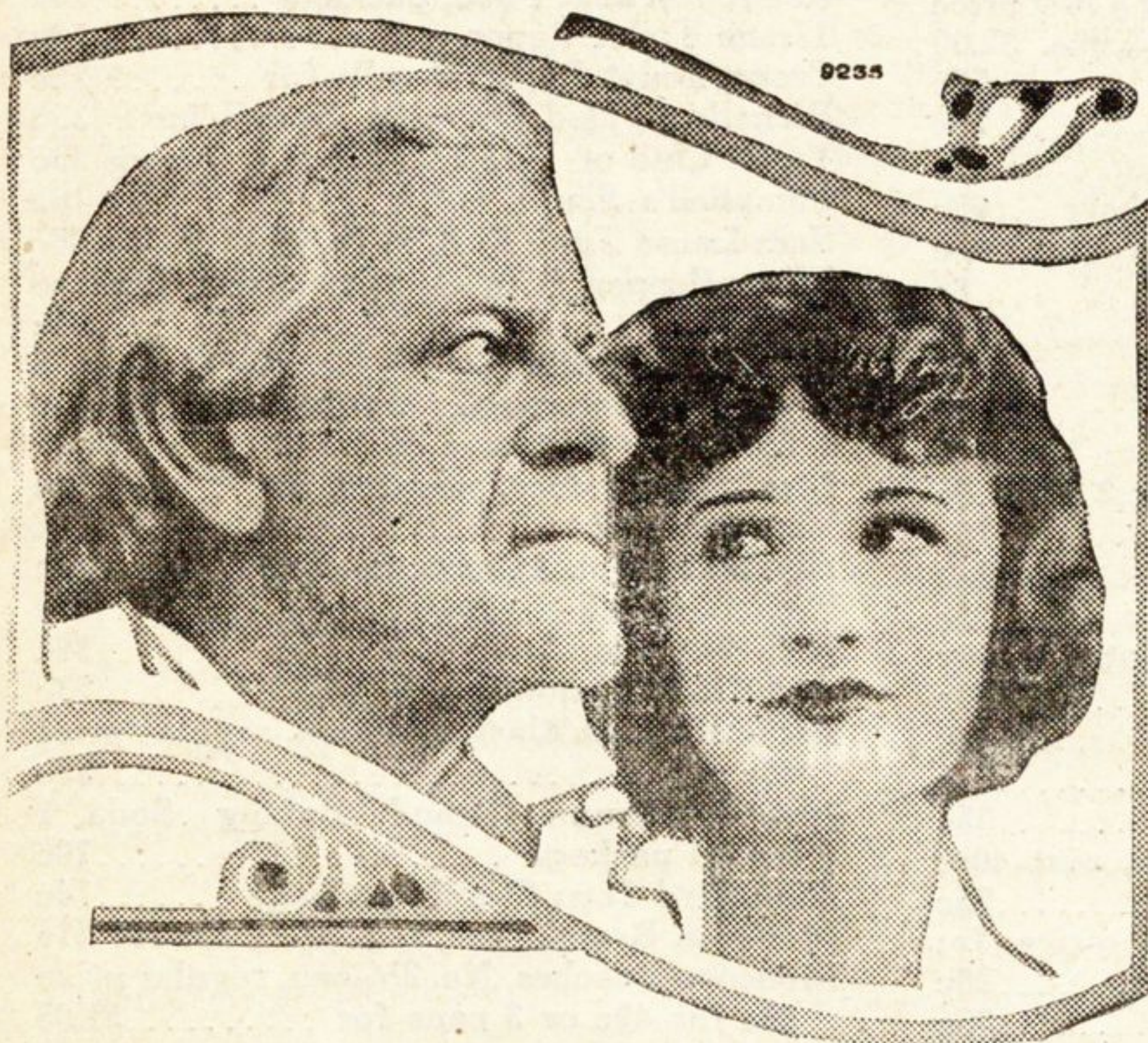
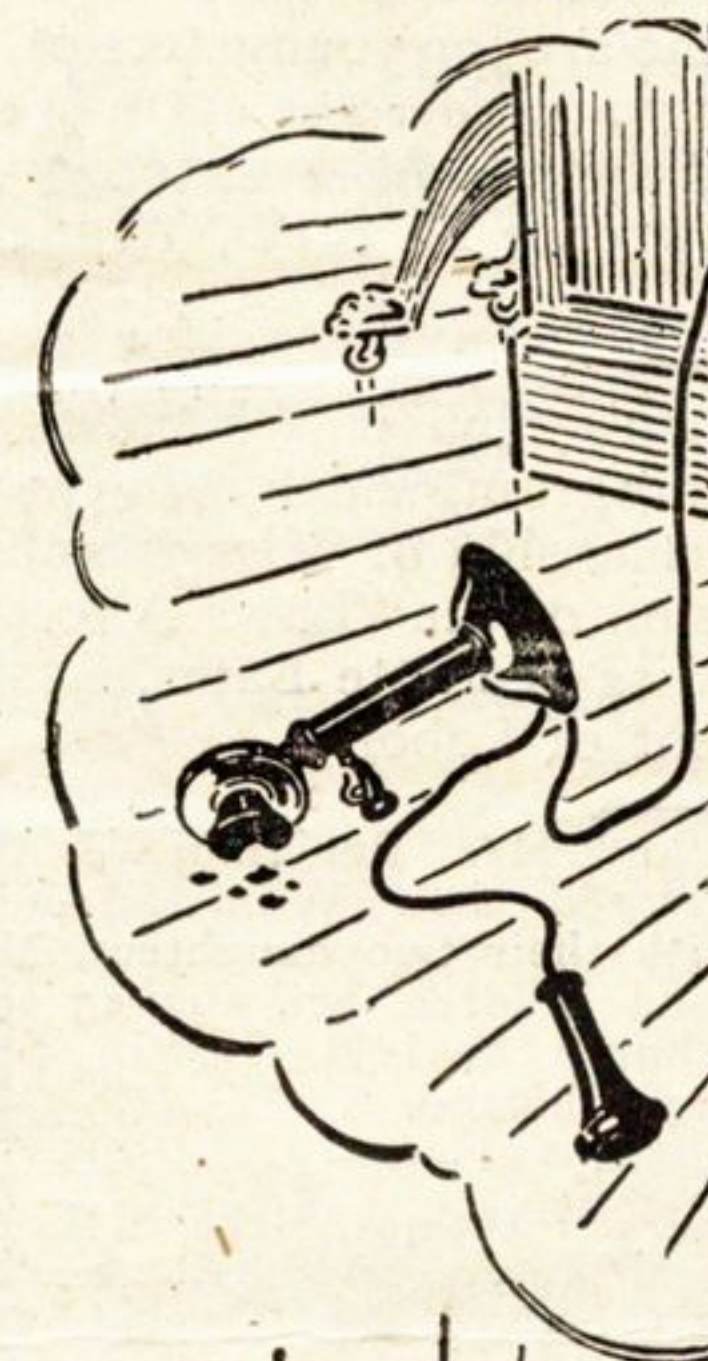

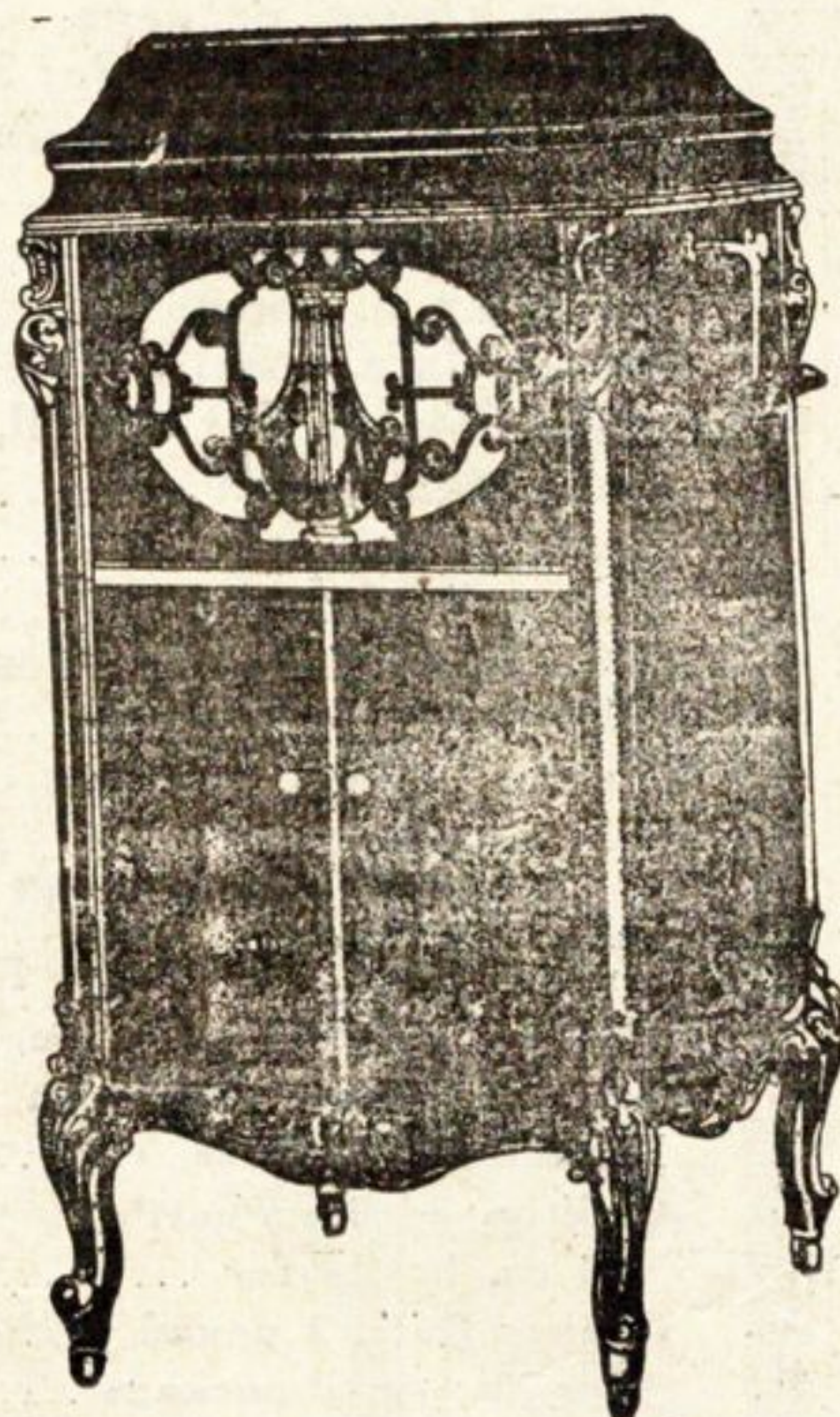
