

## DE YOUNG AND MILLER "CON-CON" DELEGATES

Carry Seventh Senatorial District in Tuesday Election By Large Majority Over Adolph C. Rouland

### BOND ISSUES ARE FAVORED

Public Policy Questions Also Favored By North Shore Voters; Balloting Is Light

Frederic C. DeYoung of Harvey, Illinois, and Amos C. Miller of Kenilworth, Tuesday were elected by an overwhelming majority as delegates, from the Seventh Senatorial district, to the Illinois Constitutional Convention which will begin sessions in January, 1920.

Little interest was evinced in the Tuesday election as indicated by the extremely light balloting all along the north shore. In most precincts in the township the women's vote on Public Policy questions and bond propositions was so light as to have no determining effect upon the returns.

#### Gets Small Vote

Adolph Rouland, democratic candidate for delegate to the Constitutional Convention, was given a small, scattered vote over the north shore. His workers had canvassed

the entire district scattering literature far and wide over the township on Monday.

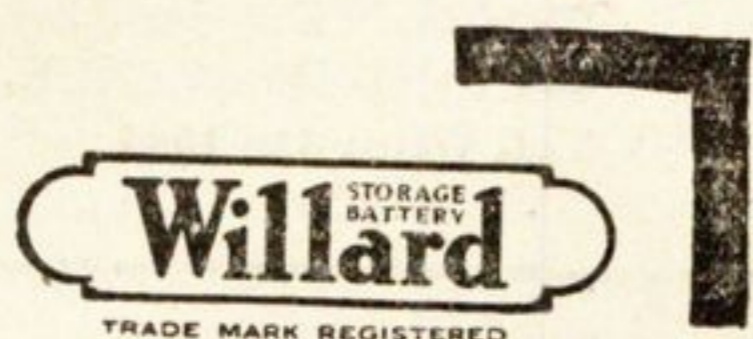
Local voters balloted favorably and by a comfortable majority on the proposition for County Good Road bonds of \$5,000,000, and provision of \$1,000,000 bonds for erection of a New County Detention Home. The balloting likewise indicated approval of the various Public Policy Questions. The Initiative and Referendum, Gateway Amendment and Public Ownership propositions all carried by a comfortable majority.

#### O'Connor Leads

In the Judicial ballot Judge O'Connor, Democrat, was given a close lead

over Struckman, Republican, for Judge of the Superior Court. Rush, Republican, was an easy victor in the Township balloting for Judge of the Circuit Court over Busch, the Democratic candidate.

A few scattered socialist votes were found in the balloting on the various candidates.
