# FAMOUS WAR WORKER HERE SUNDAY NIGHT

Dr. Samuel Watson, Winner, of Decorations From Three European Nations, Speaks at Community Service

#### IN FRANCE SEVEN YEARS

Recently Returned To America From Many Years' Work in Religious Fields in France

"Religion in France" will be the subject for the Community Sunday Evening address to be given at Community Mouse tomorrow evening. Dr. Samuel Watson is the speaker. The meeting begins at 8 o'clock.

Dr. Watson lived in France from 1912 until his recent return to America. In appreciation of his work while abroad he was decorated by the French, Belgian and Serbian nations being honored with the Legion of Honor, Order of Leopold and the Order of Saint Sava, respectively.
