

Kenilworth Leads In "Zoning" Idea; Officials Study Plans In Conference

"Zoning", recently made effective by ordinance in Kenilworth, and now under consideration in other towns on the north shore, will be the object of discussion at a meeting in the Morrison hotel, Chicago, Tuesday and Wednesday, December 16 and 17. The conference is to be held under the direction of the Citizens' Zone Plan organization of Chicago. Officials of all north shore Villages have been requested to attend the sessions in Chicago as it is felt the question of "zoning", now Chicago's most important problem, will be a matter of serious consideration in every town in Cook county in the near future.

The following detailed explanation of "zoning" should interest every progressive resident of the north shore: "The term 'zoning' has come to mean the proper regulation of buildings in a town and its purpose is to secure orderliness in community development. Zoning signifies such regulation of the height, area, use and location of buildings as will protect land owner from the loss of his

share of light, as will protect his ears from unseemly noise, his nose from obnoxious smells, and his eyes from offensive sights.

"Just as we have a place for everything in a well ordered home so we should have a place for every building in a well regulated town. What would we think of a housewife who insisted on having her gas stove in the parlor and her piano in the kitchen. Yet irregularities like these are common in community house-keeping. In what city can't we find a gas tank next to a park, garages next to schools, boiler shops next to hospitals, and stables next to churches?"

"In every town there should be a grouping of business and industries of a like nature insuring efficiency. If a factory intrudes in a business or residential district it greatly destroys the value of the surrounding property. There has been annually in the United States a greater destruction in the value of buildings by the failure to protect them from the improper use of neighboring buildings than is caused by fire.

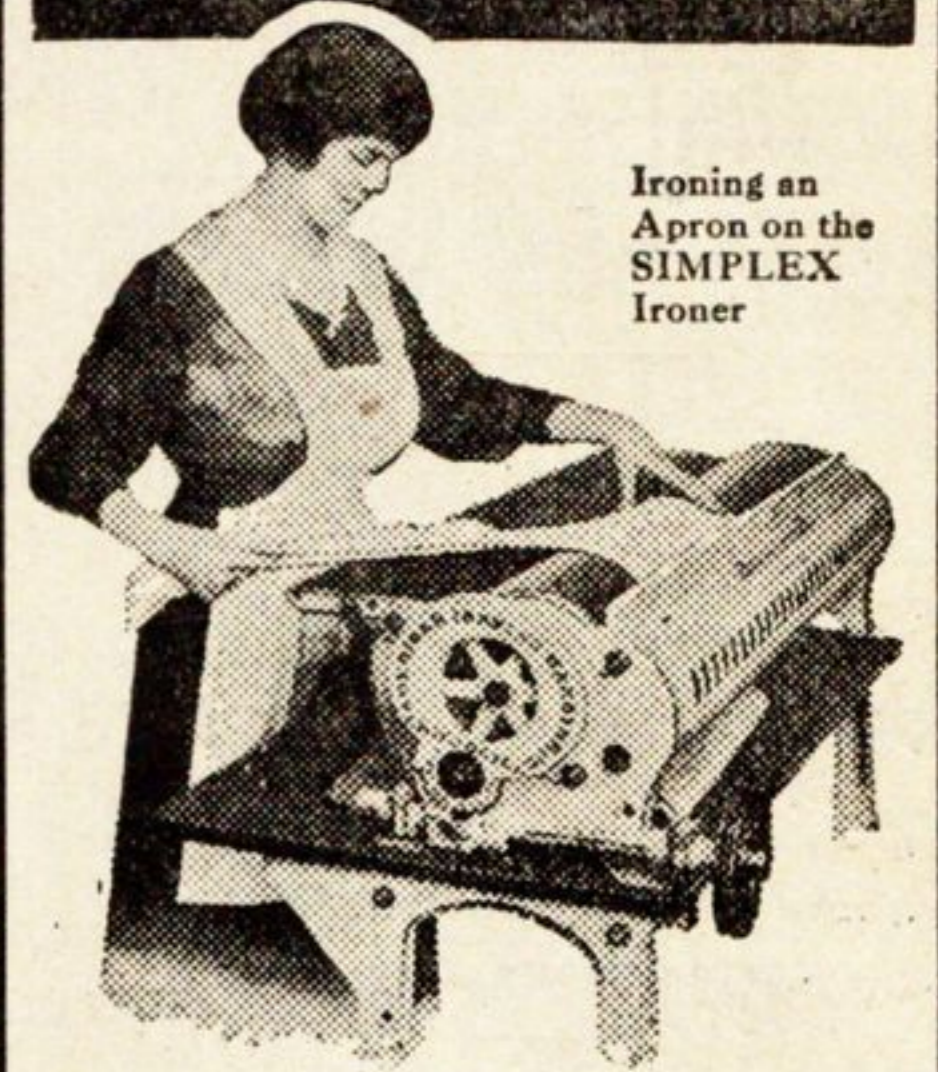

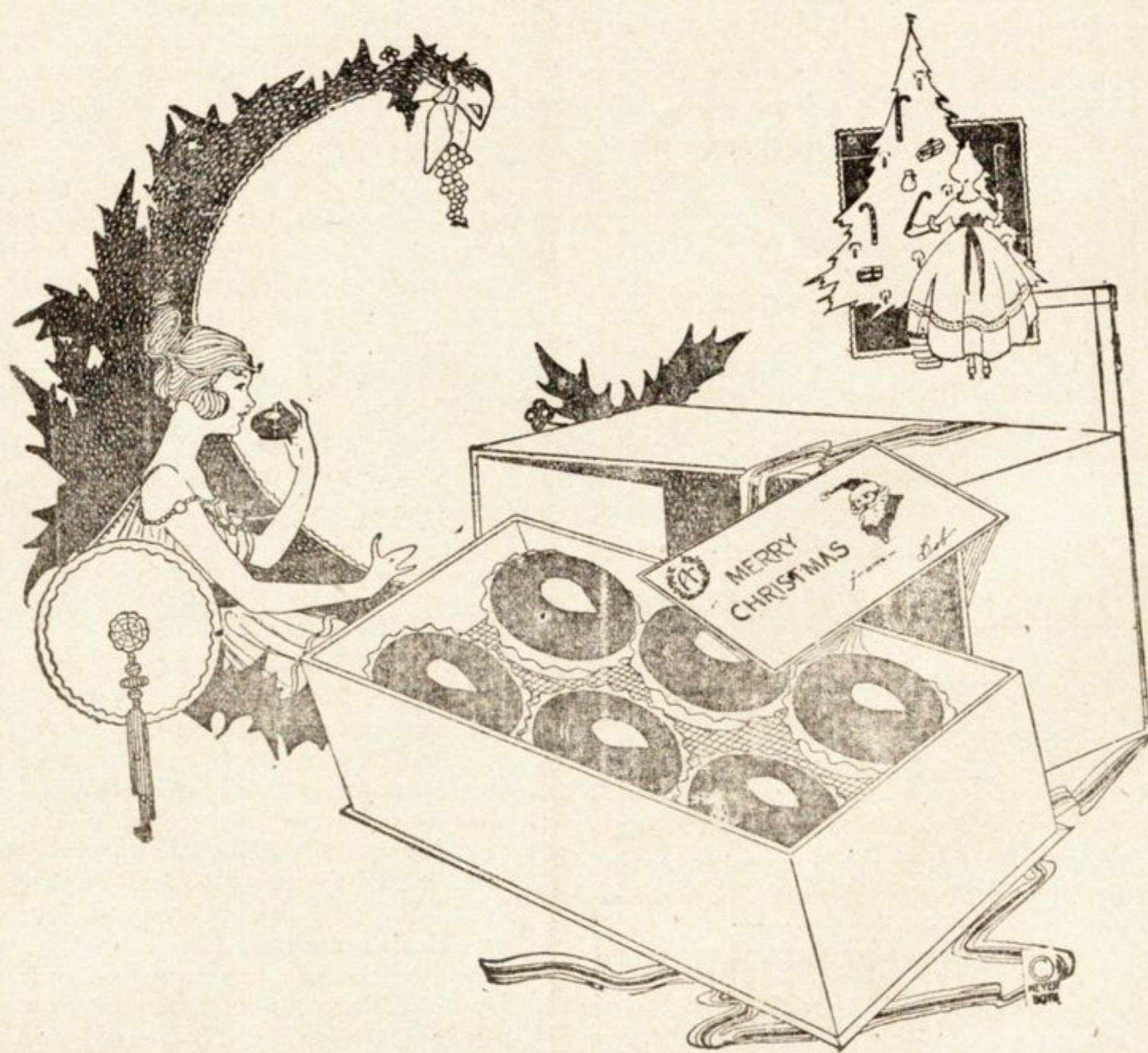
The quality and high class of these performances is assured. The best of the old and modern schools in chamber music.
