Americanization is the common term but higher and better citizenship are better words. Through various methods Community Service plans to instill into the alien born the ideals that will counteract unrest and place the disciple of unrest in the background.

PUT BABY BONDS W.S.S. ON CHRISTMAS LISTS

Savings Certificates and Stamps on Uncle Sam's Holiday Financial Bargain Counter Now

Do your Christmas planning early! Uncle Sam has the goods, whether you are man, woman or child. You can buy off the same counter, whether you are rich or in moderate circumstances.

The price of the new Government "Baby Bond"—the \$100 Treasury Savings certificate—in December is \$84.60. The recipient of that Christmas gift from you will have \$100 on January 1, 1924.

Then there is another "Baby Bond"—the \$1,000 Treasury Savings certificate. That costs \$846 in December, and in five years the recipient will have a cool one thousand dollars.

The price of War Savings Stamps in December is \$4.23. In five years that will yield five dollars.

Then for the children there are the Thrift stamps at twenty-five cents a throw.

So, you see, Uncle Sam has on his holiday bargain counter something to suit men, women and children in all walks of life.

To the person who has learned to save through war-time necessity a present of a "Baby Bond" or a War Savings stamp will be a welcome gift.

Perhaps the gift of a War Savings stamp or one of the new Treasury Savings certificates will start the recipient on a career of saving that may lead to his or her financial independence.

These government securities are

non-depreciable and non-fluctuating. The Savings certificates are issued only in registered form with the name of the owner on them. The registration records are kept in Washington. This protects the owner. The \$100 certificates may be purchased at post offices of the first and second class and at banks; the \$1,000 certificates may be obtained through banks. Certificates of either denomination may be ordered direct from the Seventh District War Savings organization, 105 West Monroe street, Chicago.
