Emma Goldman and Alexander Berkman could not give a better exhibition of their purposes than in the reluctance that they have displayed in going back to the country from which they came. Russia has everything that they urge upon this country. There there is neither law nor order. There no institutions demand the respect of the people. Every man is a law unto himself and life and property have no claim for protection. It is the heaven of which Emma Goldman and Alexander Berkman have preached, but they don't want to go there at all.

It is characteristic of the trouble maker that when the trouble breaks he seeks new fields of endeavor. They

have no desire to share the desolation that they strive to effect. If these two disciples of anarchy had been able to bring about the results that they have sought we should find them eagerly seeking passage to foreign shores. But they very much wish the shelter of the law they despise and deride.

No better punishment could have been devised than the sending of these two back to the distracted country to which they belong. They cannot hurt Russia. They will have a beautiful opportunity to see in operation the theories which they have tried to teach here. Other nations should see to it that they stay in Russia.

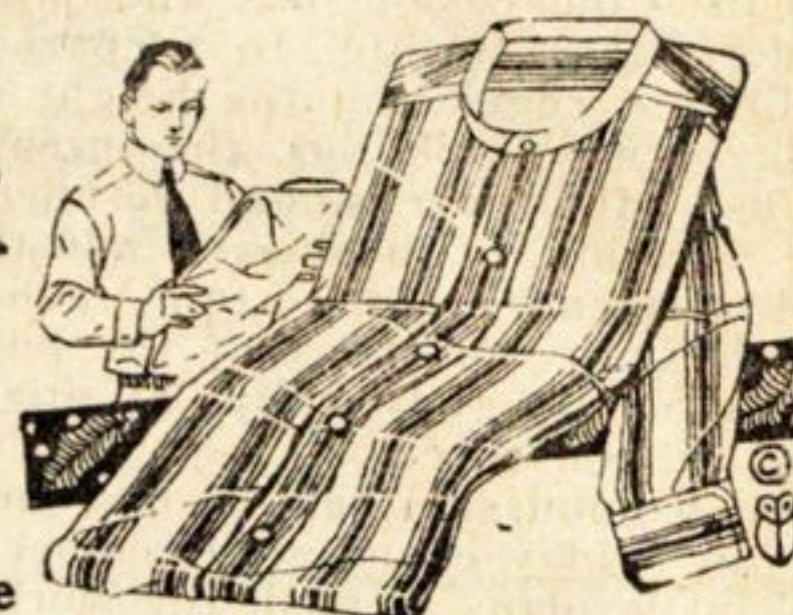
