

LOANS TO FARMERS

The bill introduced by Representative Carl W. Riddick, of Montana to provide \$4,000,000 for loans to farmers in drought-stricken sections of the United States for the purpose of seed for the 1920 spring planting is meeting with general approval among the farmers. It is stated in the bill that no loan shall be made to any farmer in a greater sum than \$300, and that all loans shall be made through national or state banks, and be secured by a first lien on the cured. Any one making a false oath as to the facts is fined \$1,000 or imprisoned six months or both.
