Amy Macintyre Selected to Write Dr. Alice Barlow-Brown in Serbia; Writes Poem to Send with \$40 Raised in Schools

Since Amy has launched herself upon an author's career her father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Duncan Macintyre, who live at 533 Hawthorn lane, have been kept busy thinking up ideas for Amy's literary talent.

Amy, who is only 12 years old, is making a strong bid for the juvenile poet laureate title of Winnetka. 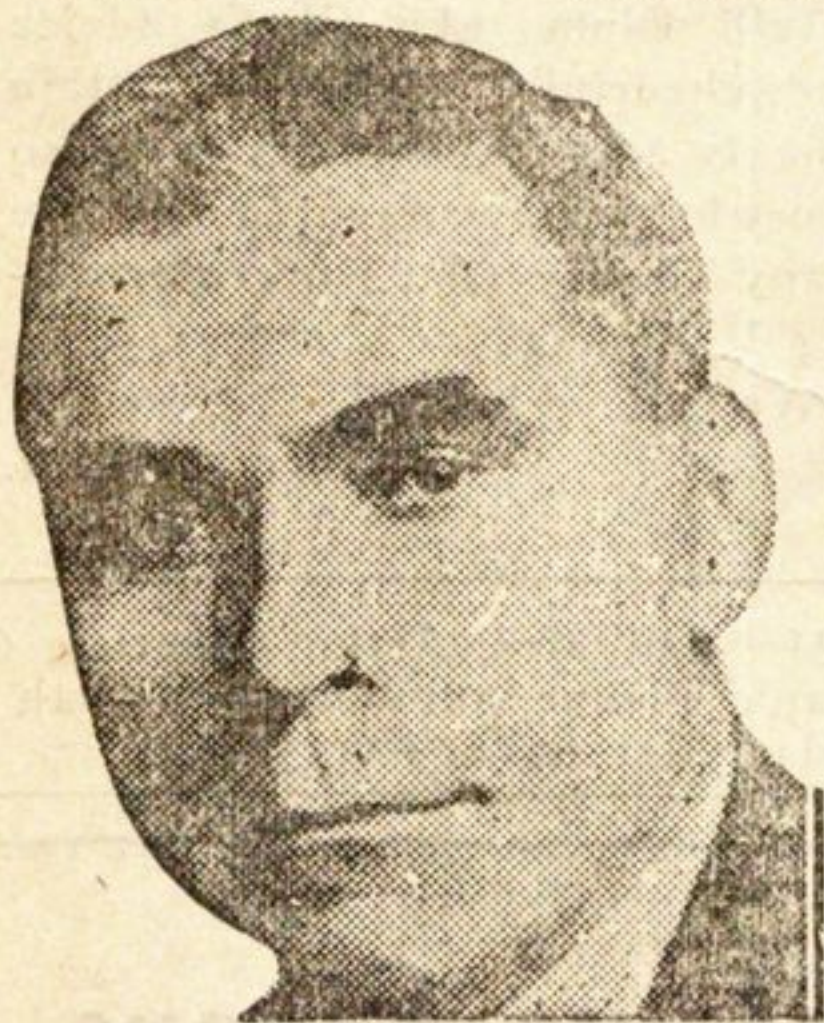
With the exception of the Cook county territory, which has three of its four deputy sheriffs' positions filled, the north shore towns are prepared to reduce speeding to a minimum.

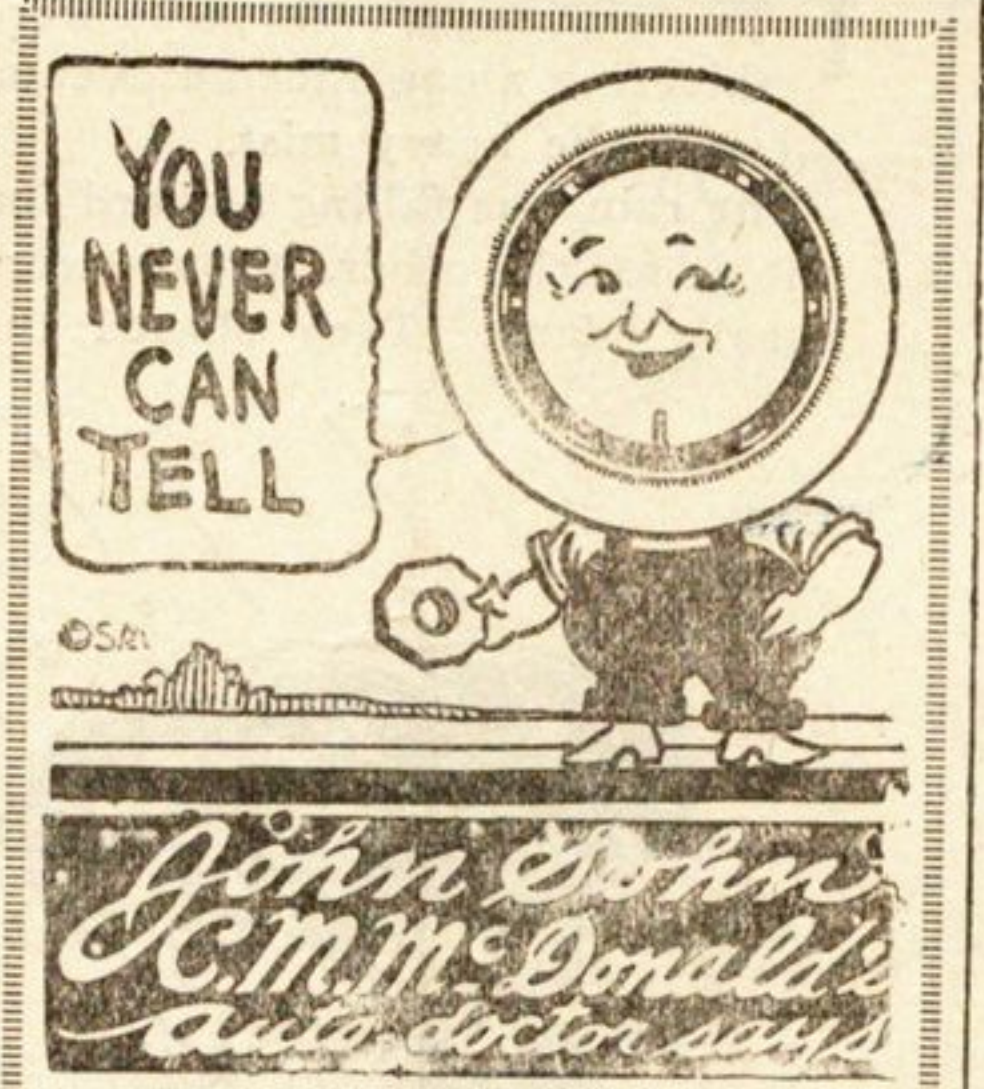

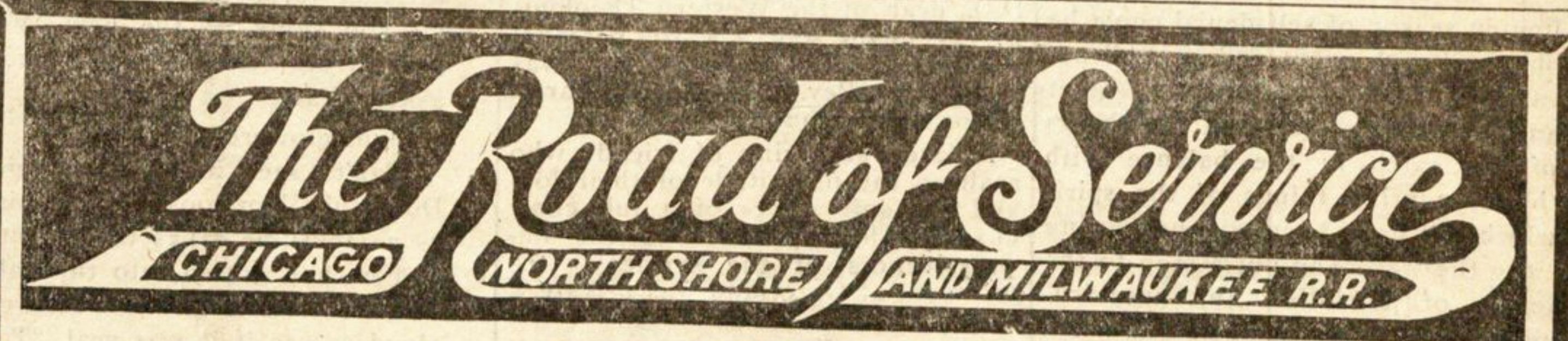
As a result the service of public utilities was greatly impaired and much time and money will be required for their restoration.

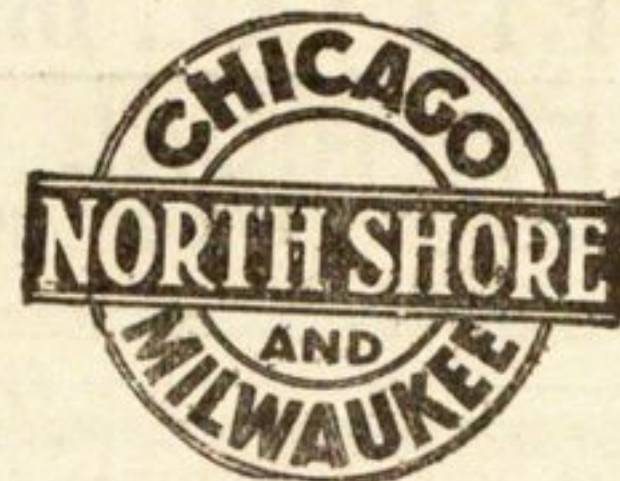
