Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois, having ordered the improvement of Gordon Terrace from the present pavement in North Avenue to the present pavement in Chatfield road, by excavating, grading, draining, constructing brick masonry catch basins with connections, grading parkways, preparing the subgrade, adjusting present brick pavement, and paving with Portland cement concrete, including an integral curb, a roadway nineteen (19) feet in width, all in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the Village Clerk of said Village, and the said Village having applied to the Superior Court of Cook County, Illinois, for an assessment of the cost of said improvement according to the benefits, and an assessment therefor having been made and returned to said Court, General Number 348659, the final hearing thereon will be held on the fifteenth day of March, A. D. 1920, or as soon thereafter as the business of the said Court will permit. All persons desiring may file objections in said Court before said day, and may appear on the hearing and make their defense. Said ordinance provides for the collection of said assessment in ten (10) annual installments with interest thereon at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum.
