

**NEW TRIER BASKETBALL TEAM WIN TWO SHIELDS**

**Lightweights and Featherweights Win Suburban League Championship and Play for County Honor**

New Trier High school has earned considerable of the basketball laurels of the suburban league this year, with the honors of the league in the featherweight and lightweight divisions going to the north shore institution. squad will engage the Austin team in the Cook county tilt. The local students, having already won two shields, are in a poyous mood and are rooting hard for their athletes to win the Cook county honors.

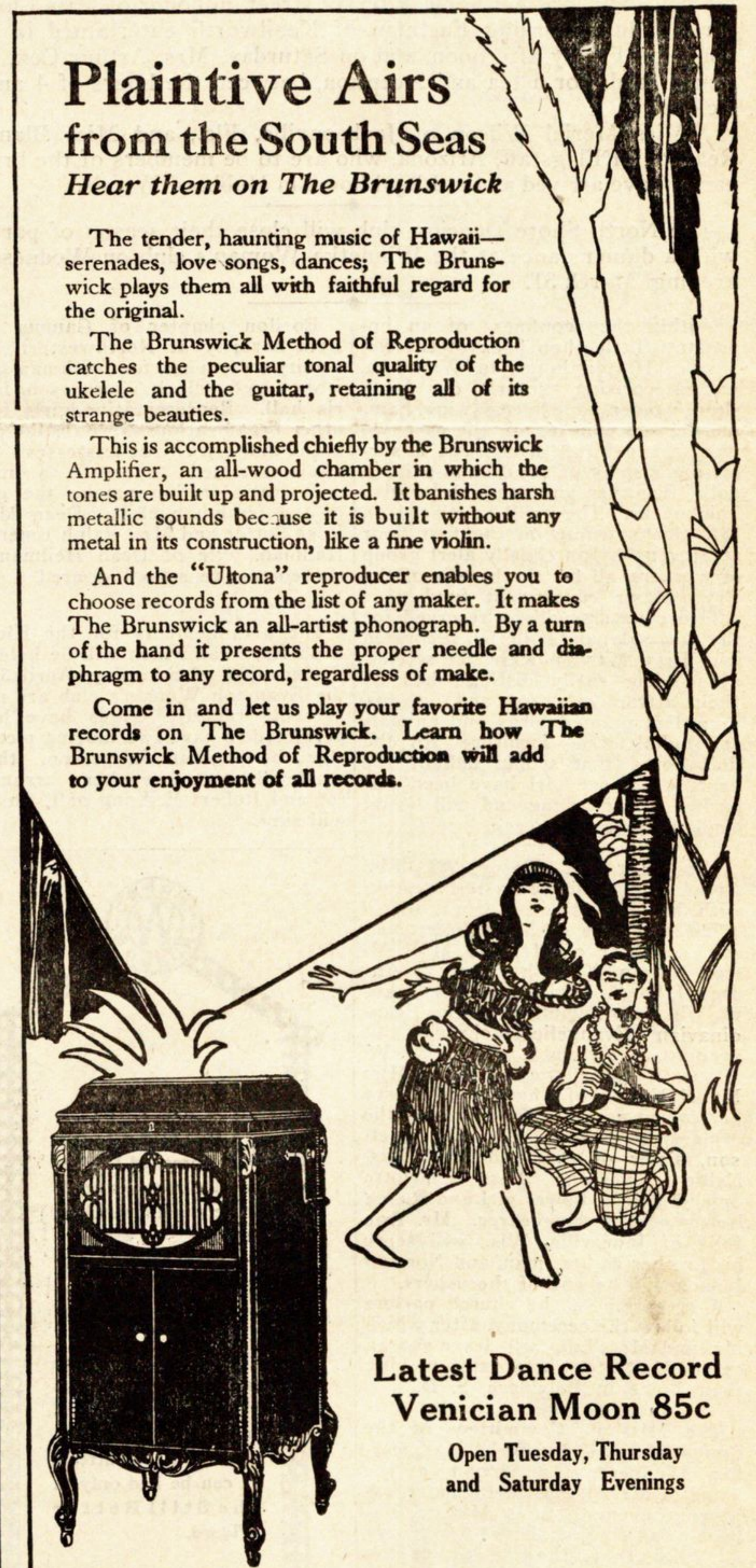
