

**MOTORCYCLE SQUAD IS READY TO BEGIN DRIVE**

**Local Police Department Plans To Have Two Men Patrol Streets at Night and Third in Daytime**

One of the most efficient motorcycle squads—if not the best—is the one which Winnetka will send out to protect its highways and byways from the risks of promiscuous driving.

With the arrival of two new motor cycles, which have been expected for weeks, and are promised for April 1, three men of the police department will take to the roads, two maintaining a sharp vigilance at night for speeders and mid-night maulers, and the third speed cop patrolling the village streets in the daytime.

Chief of Police W. M. Pearson has announced that Grover Hendricks will occupy the latter position on the squad and Albert Ottone and John Hanselman will be partners in the night work.

The plan of sending two riders out at night is a comparatively new one, but the chief is of the opinion it will prove very successful in checking raids by burglars. The men will both be armed for any emergency and by traveling together they can be of assistance to each other in the advent of trouble.

The two new motorcycles, for which appropriation was recently made by the village council, are of the most modern type and are especially built for speed and service.
