

OAKLAND-PHILIPS CO. BUYS ELECTRIC GARAGE

New Automobile Firm Takes Over Location of Evanston Electric Company at 1013 Davis Street

Announcement was made this week that, due to the popularity of the Oakland car on the north shore, the Oakland-Phillips company has deemed it advisable to take over the entire building now occupied by the Evanston Electric garage at 1013-17 Davis street, Evanston. The new company will take possession on May 1.

The garage in question is said to be the largest structure of its kind between Chicago and Milwaukee. The garage comprises a single, large floor. Sky-lights, covering the entire roof of the structure, provide excellent lighting during the day and specially arranged lighting system provides three strings of large arc lights for night illumination. The building is said to be one of the best lighted garages in the United States.

Easy Access

A feature of the new location is the unique arrangement of entrance and exit which permits easy access to and from the garage from Davis street and to Maple avenue. Storage space, comprising more than 15,000 square feet, is announced open for reservation by the month. Car owners of the north shore are invited to inspect the building at any time.

The announced policy of the Oakland-Phillips company is to render the highest class service possible. The company is enabled, due to the facility of access to the garage and shops, to amply provide for the comforts of motor driving heretofore largely denied residents of the north shore.

The service department of the Oakland-Phillips company is under the

supervision of Edward R. Bell, formerly of Stedman's garage, 724 Elm street, Winnetka. Mr. Bell says he will be particularly pleased to assist his north shore acquaintances as the shop is to be thoroughly equipped to take care of all motor requirements.

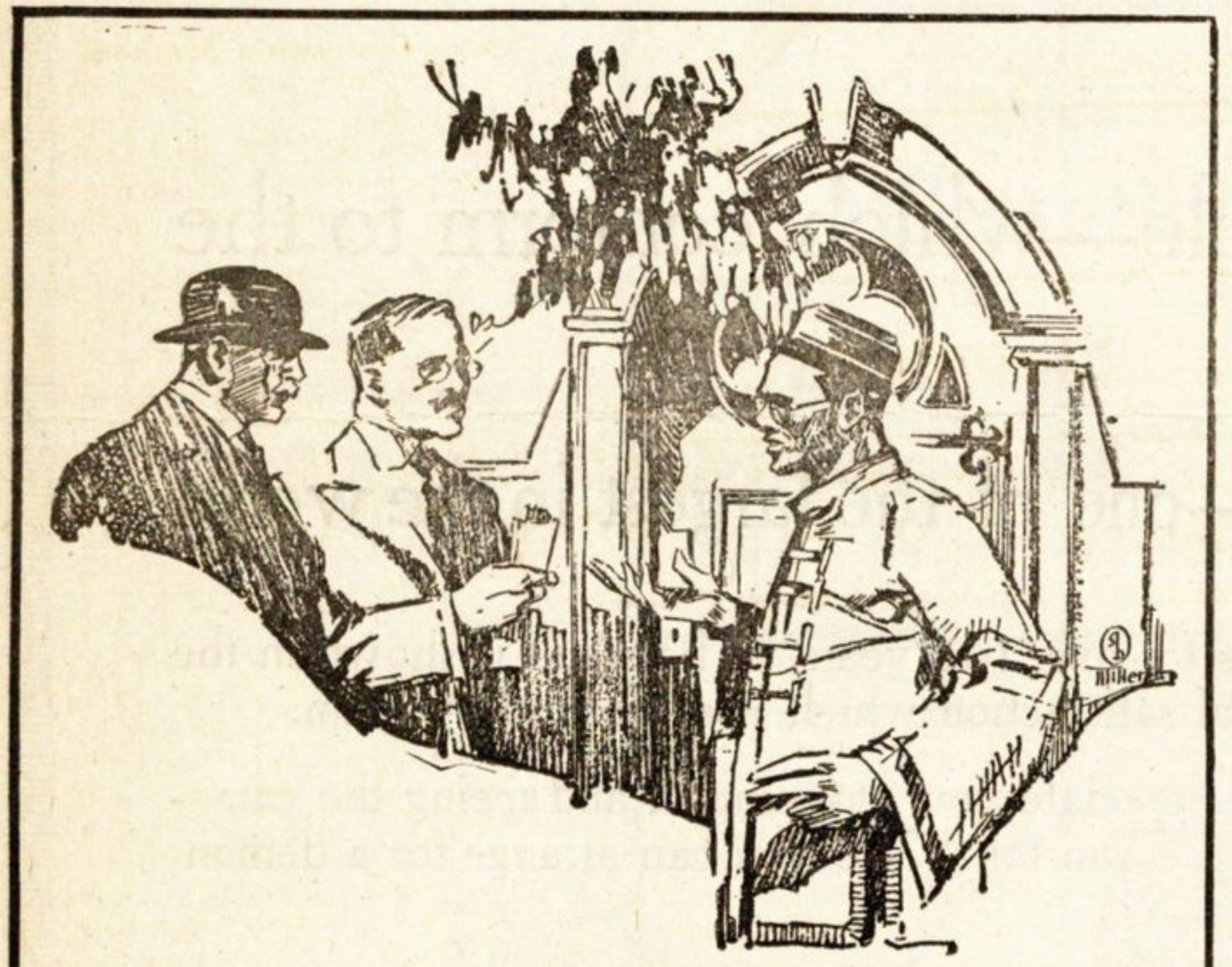
