

Gets High Awards For Photography

W. J. Root, North Shore Photographer, Wins Many Prizes For Excellence of Work.

Eight times awarded the highest prize for this work in photography in some national or international exhibit is the record of W. J. Root of the North Shore Studio, Evanston.

Mr. Root came to the north shore just one year ago this month. For twenty-five years he was located in the Kimball building, Chicago, where, in addition to his regular trade, he was employed by the Continental Commercial and First National banks to photograph all their employes. This job alone brought him from twenty to thirty sittings a day.

Moved to Evanston.

In May he gave up his studio in Chicago and moved to Evanston, where he has taken rooms on the third floor of the Hoyburn building. Here, at an expense of almost \$4,000, he has made many interior changes, decorations and refurnishings, turning the floor into one of the most modern and attractive studios on the north shore.

One of the evidences of his excellent record as a master of photographic art to which Mr. Root points with pride is the series of gold, bronze and silver medals awarded

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois, having ordered the construction of a vitrified glazed tile pipe sanitary sewer, including brick masonry manholes with cast iron covers, vitrified tile pipe drop connections encased in concrete, vitrified tile pipe house slants closed with vitrified tile discs, in Elm Street from and connecting with the present sanitary sewer at the intersection of Elm Street and Berkeley Avenue, east in Elm Street, to and connecting with the present sanitary sewer at the intersection of Elm Street with Glendale Avenue, all in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the Village Clerk of said village, and the said village having applied to the Superior Court of Cook County, Illinois, for an assessment of the cost of said improvement according to the benefits, and an assessment therefor having been made and returned to said Court, General Number 351467, the final hearing thereon will be held on the twenty-fourth day of May, A. At the World's Fair in Chicago he received a massive solid bronze medal as the highest award, and at the San Francisco mid-winter fair he was again given first prize, also a bronze medal and certificate.

In the national exhibitions of the photographers' association he has twice been awarded first prize, consisting of a large gold medal nearly three inches in diameter. These medals, as well as his record in Chicago, testify to his ability and experience.

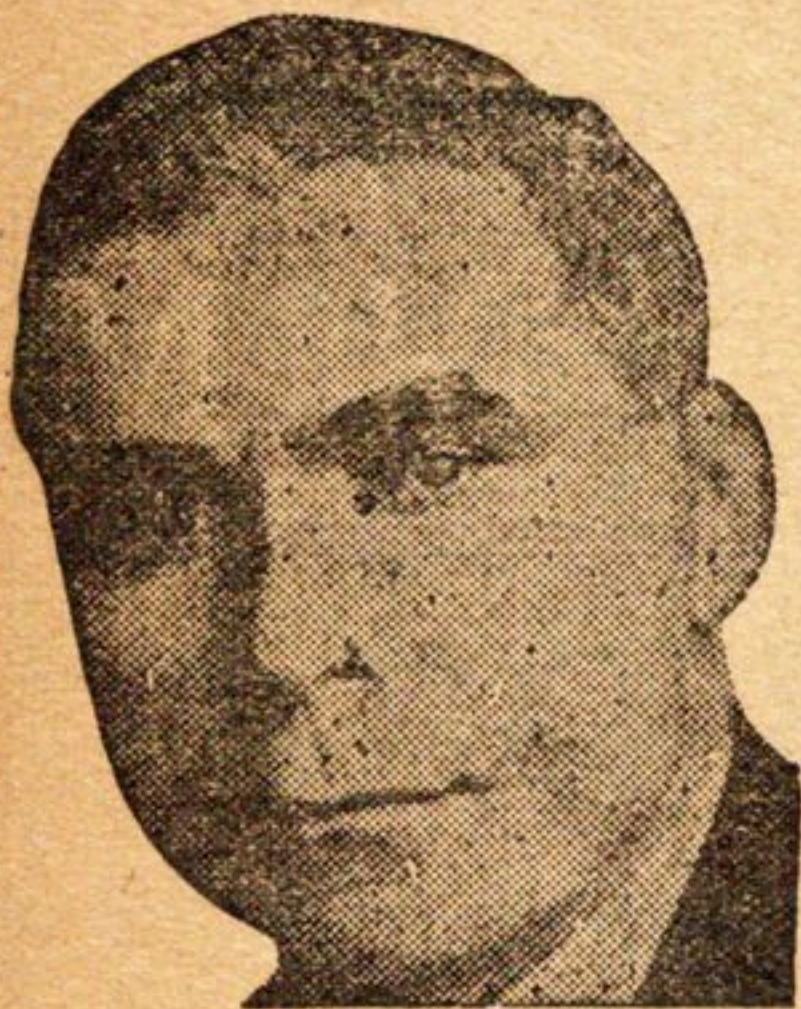
