High Labor Costs

This has necessitated borrowing \$325,000, it is pointed out, and resulted in a condition "where credit is so seriously impaired" as to make it impossible for the Gas company "to borrow more money". The present scale of rates. it is said, is inadequate to insure effective operation.

Charge Procrastination

The Commission censures the Gas company for its procrastination in fling an inventory report with the Commission, thus delaying prompt investigation by the Commission engineers.

"Evidence presented shows that the revenue of the company in 1919, after deducting operating expenses and taxes amounted to \$154,000, and that \$35,000 is the annual amount which should be allowed for the purposes of taking care of accruing depreciation.' Show Increased Cost

Increased cost of labor and material, the Commission holds, will necessitate an increase in operating expenditure for 1920 of at least \$30, .000 over 1919.
