URGE PROVISION FOR ALL DISABLED WAR VETERANS

At a meeting of the Winnetka Post No. 10, American Legion, Tuesday evening members voted to dispatch a telegram to the United States senators from Illinois and the congressman of this district embodying the following:

"In accordance with resolutions previously mailed you, the Winnetka Post of the American Legion by unanimous vote, May 25, again urges that all men discharged from military and naval service with physical disability be adequately provided for by the government before consideration by Congress of the bonus legislation for discharged men in good health." The telegram was signed by R. W. Hardenburgh, Commander of the Winnetka Post.

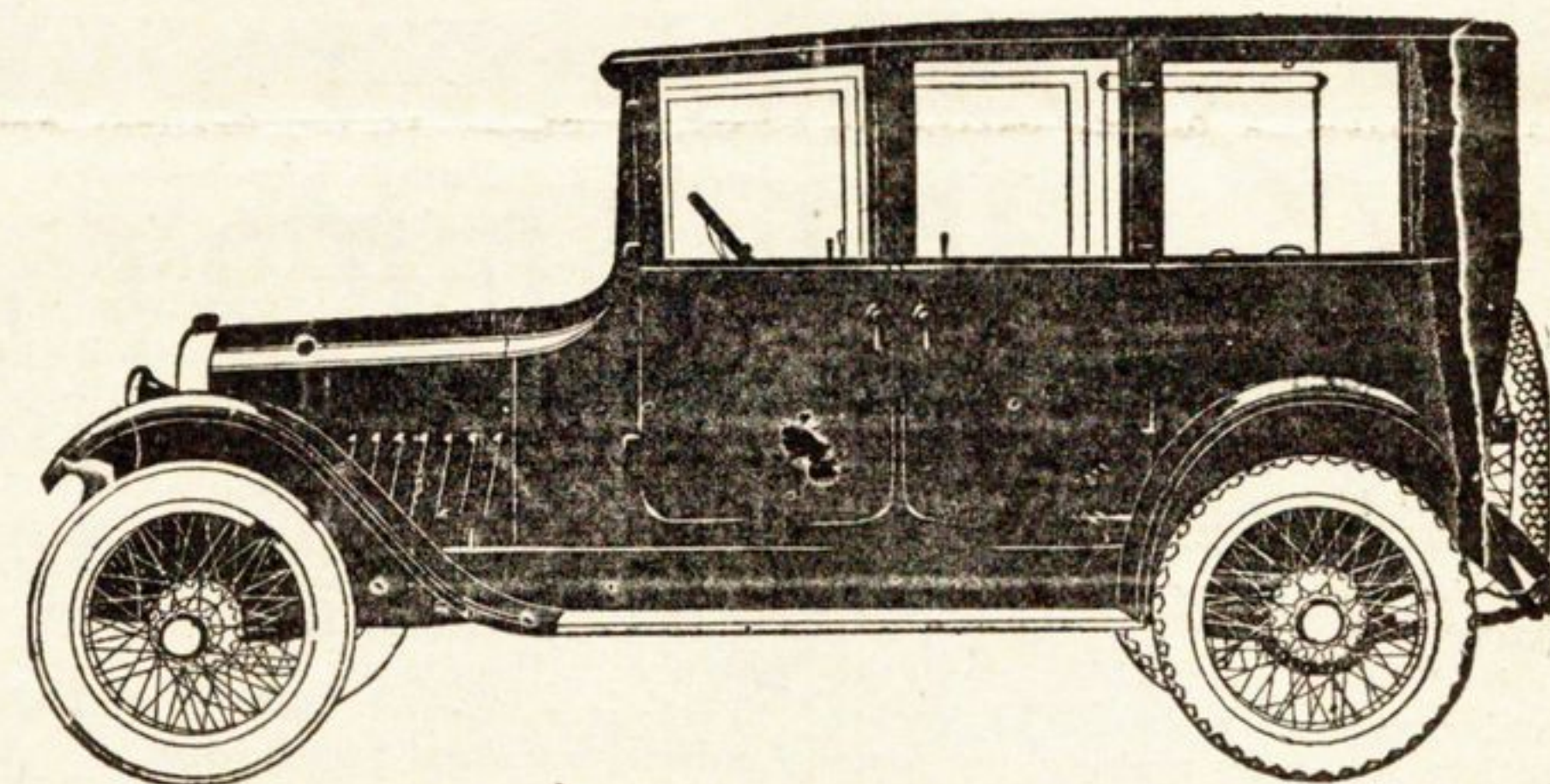
