Chief of Police in Final Warning To Those Who Have Not Paid Up Dog and Vehicle Tax

"Stop! Look! and Listen!" is Chief of police W. M. Peterson's warning to Winnetka tax-payers who have failed to comply with the law in regard to the payment of dog, automobile, and other vehicle licenses.

Payment on these items was due in May but a number of citizens have been guilty of procrastination, thus occasioning extra work for the police and possible inconvenience to themselves.

Residents who fail to pay these licenses will be subject to call into court to give reason for delinquency. Failure to comply with this measure of the law makes the delinquent subject to a heavy fine, it is said.

Chief Peterson, it appears, has displayed leniency in this matter and it is expected those who have not met their obligations in this regard will hasten to pay up at the village hall.

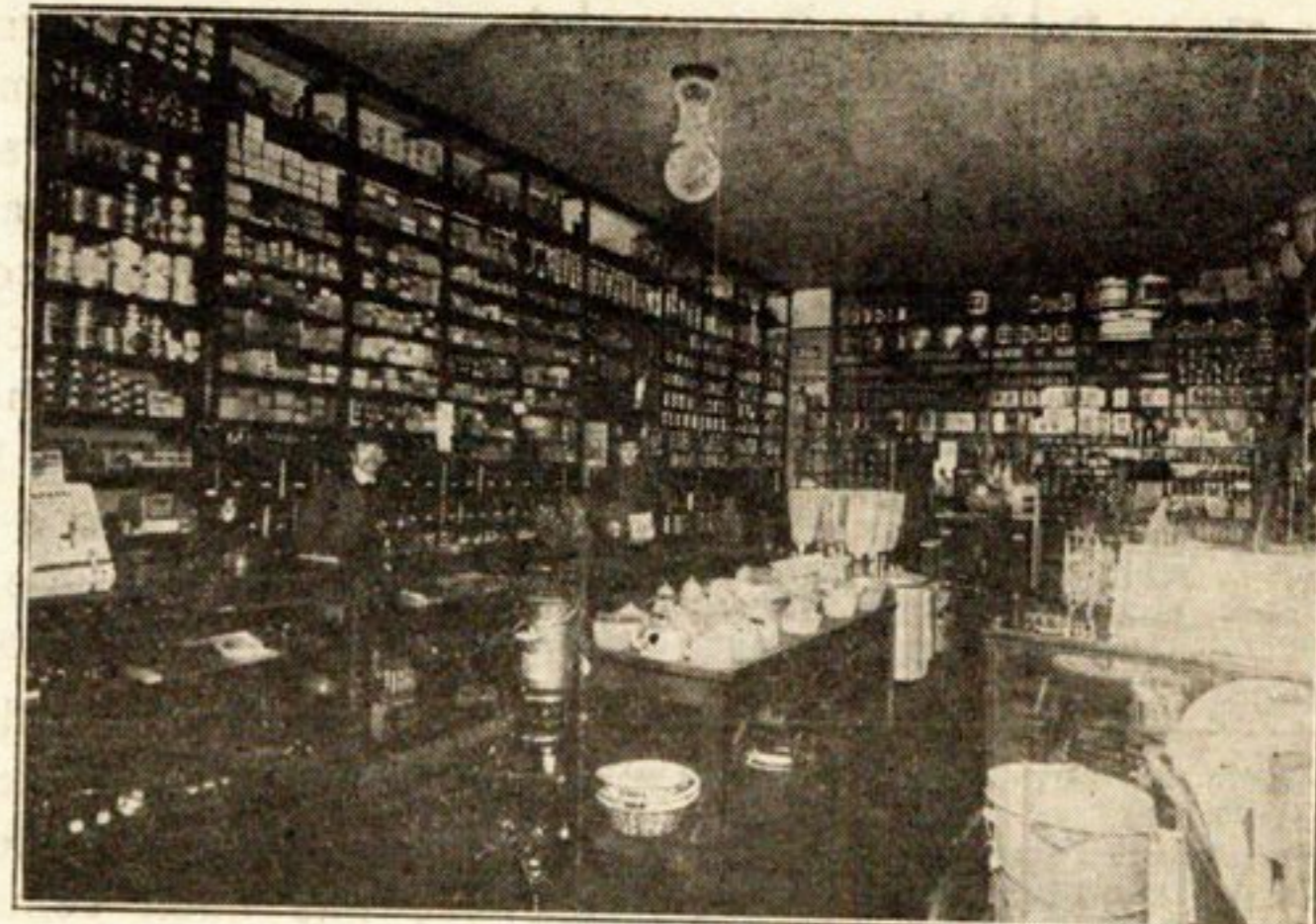

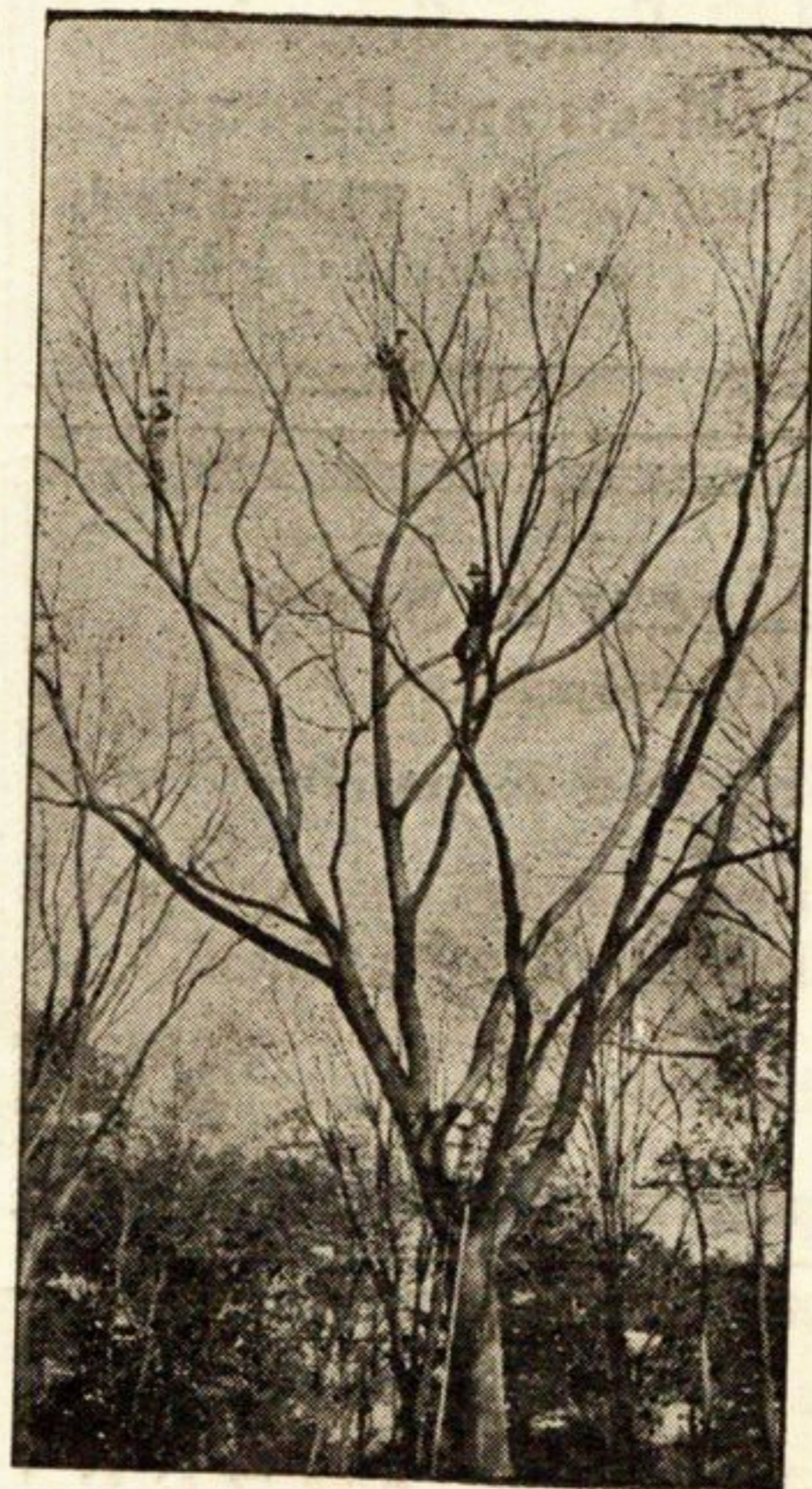
