Many beautiful gifts were received by the happy couple together with a veritable flood of letters and telegrams.

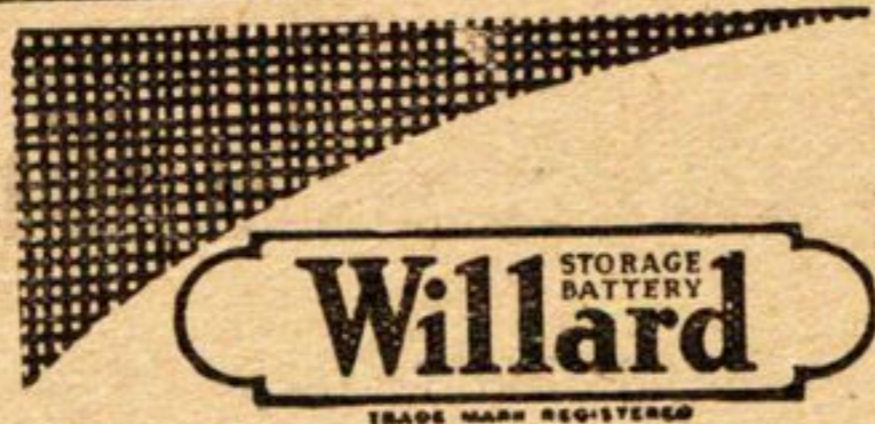
**DISTINGUISHED WAR HERO

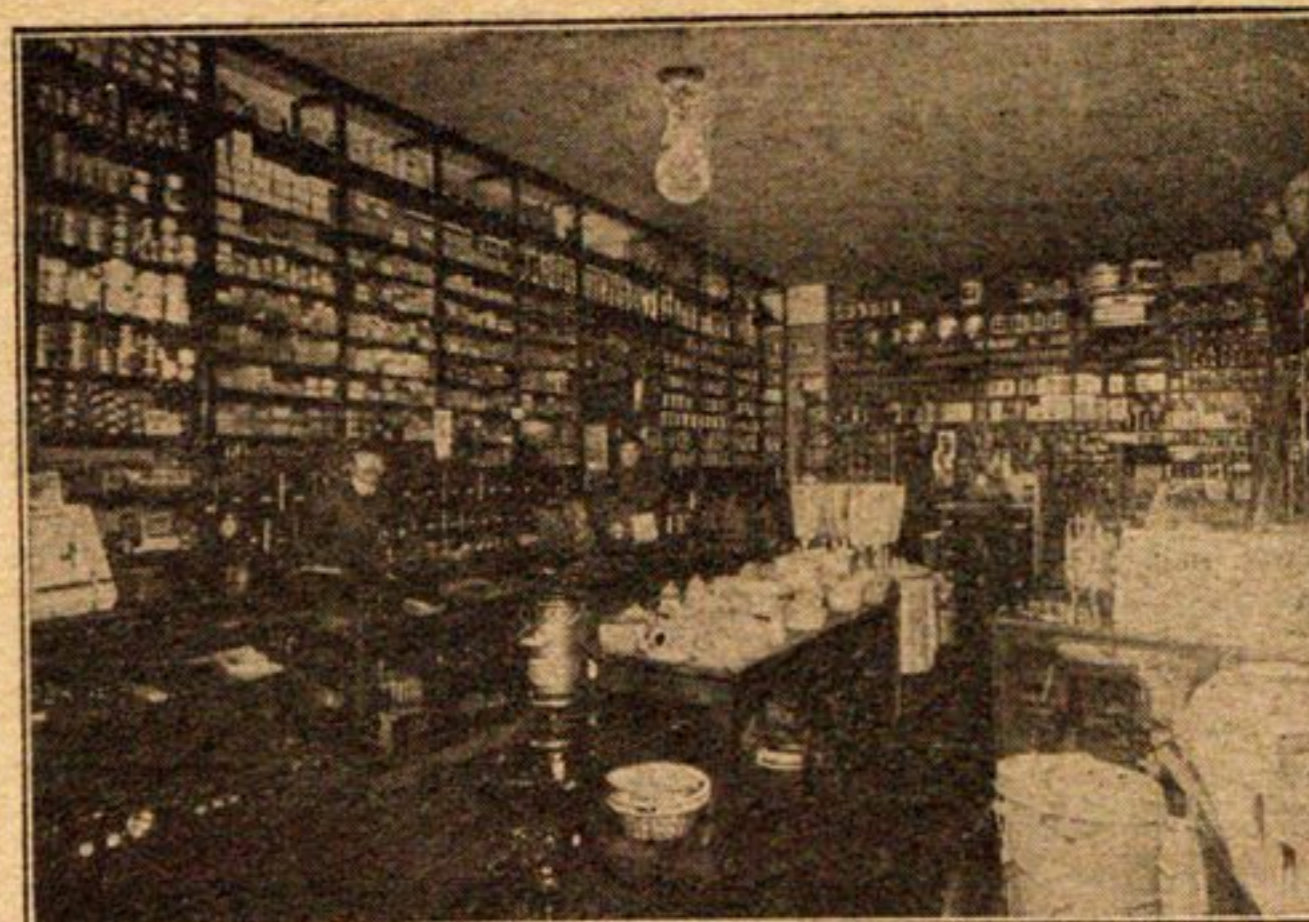

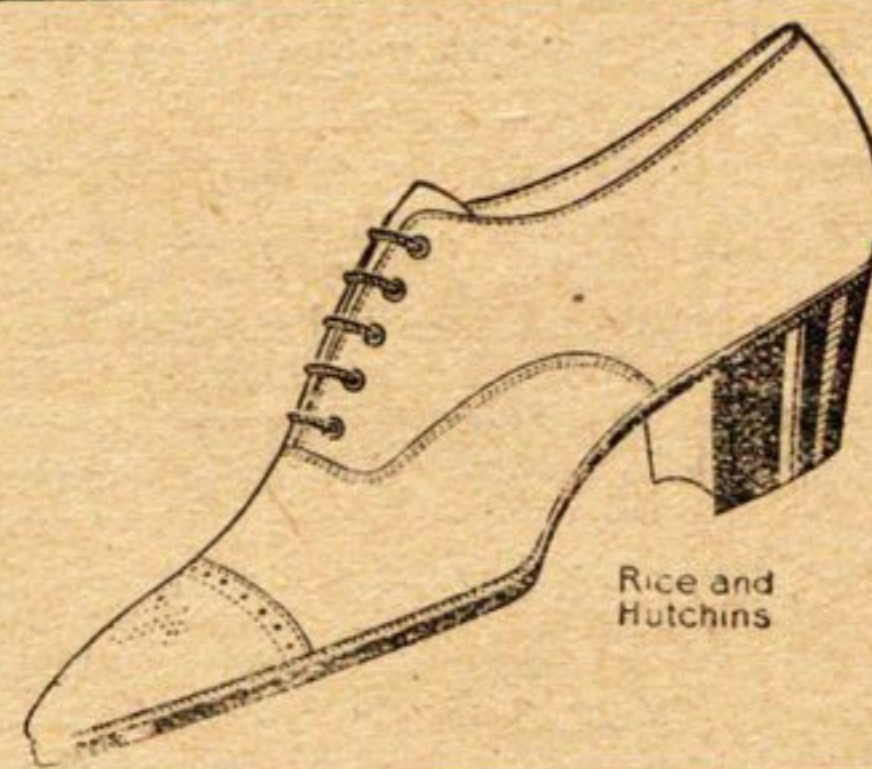

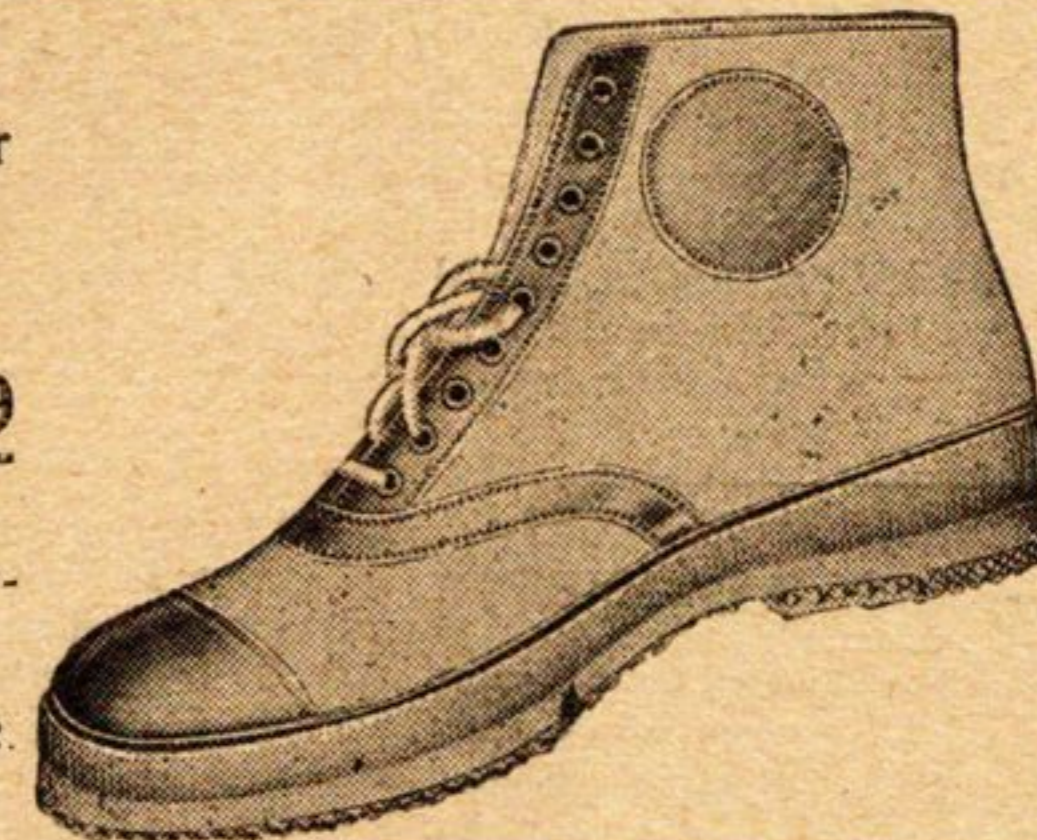
