Women In The Presidential Campaign

A wise choice has been made in the selection of the women who will serve on the republican campaign committee. Recognition of ability and influence in suffrage circles rather than of wealth or social position is evident, a radical change of tactics from the campaign of 1916 which ought to be fruitful of good results.

Mrs. Harriet Taylor Upton, Ohio suffragist, has been made vice chairman of the committee, a tribute to her influence with the women of her state as well as to the state in general. Ohio is likely to be hotly disputed territory when the voting is done in November and every hold upon the people is urgently advisable.

Women will play an important part in the presidential election this year whether they are fully enfranchised or not. The very uncertainty of the ratification of the Anthony amendment by the thirty-sixth state makes it essential that the women be considered in the party conventions as voters, no matter what the opinion of the men who have the direction of policies in their hands. The fact stands out that there may be something over twenty millions of votes cast by women in the fall election and must be considered in the preliminary days of the campaign. It was the thought of the woman's vote more than any other consideration that kept the republican platform free from a plank urging the liberalizing of the Volstead enforcement act. It is the thought of the woman's vote that will probably keep a "wet" plank out of the democratic platform, that and the influence of William Jennings Bryan, the man who refuses to be ignored in the direction of the party policies.

Round and Square

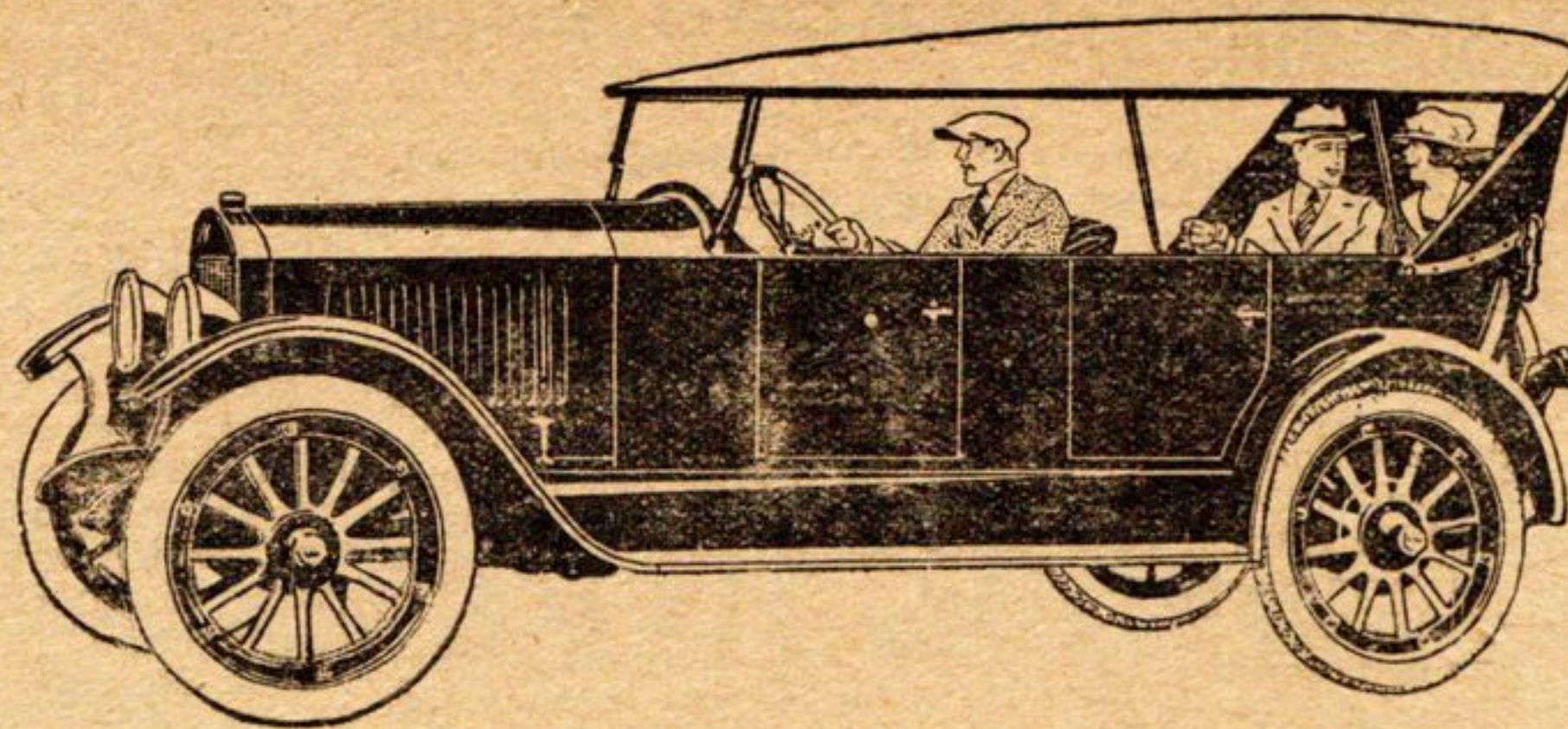

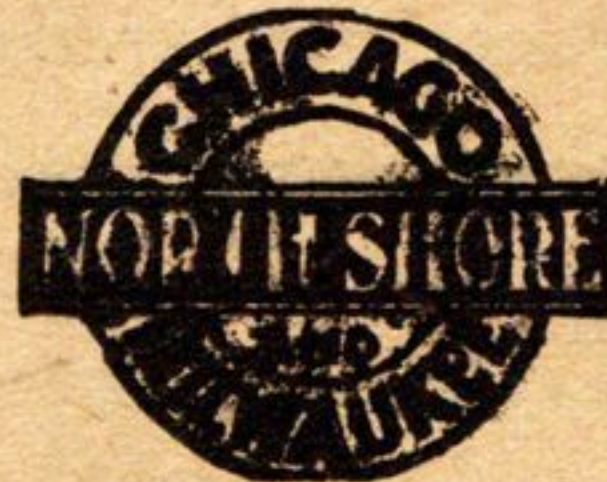
