## Clothing For All Ages

"Many of these people have but a scanty supply of clothing and are very grateful for the garments that are supplied by the people of the north shore from their store of old clothing. Clothes for all ages from the smallest baby to the most wrinkled old grandmother are needed. Any number of shoes can be used and clothing for children between the ages of 5 and 12 is especially desired. Sweaters or coats are appreciated on the chilly mornings when anything from an old fur to a pillow slip is used to wrap the children in until a hot breakfast and plenty of exercise warms the blood.

"Blankets are expensive these days and old ones can be used nicely to help out. Also ragged comforters can a Vassar girl. She was graduated be made over into small ones for the babies' cribs. The little tots like to be wheeled around in baby carriages too, and the supply is never equal to the demand. There are never enough toys to go around when the weather is too bad to permit play outside.
