#### Inspection of South East Pavements

On Wednesday, August 14, the Board of Local Improvements, together with the village engineer, the village manager, and the contractor, Mr. John O'Gara of Chicago, made a careful inspection of the system of concrete pavements in the south east section of the village. The purpose of this inspection was to determine the additional amount of work to be required of the contractor to repair defective sections of the work.

The inspection disclosed that the general condition of the pavements is excellent, the work being particularly free from objectionable cracking. At a few points expansion has caused the slabs to be raised up at the joints, due to the separators not having been installed in a vertical position.

In several instances, the finished surface of the pavement was found to have been slightly damaged by frost, giving a rough appearance, but not affecting the quality of the body of the concrete. At a number of points the curb was found to be cracked, or otherwise defective.

The contractor and the engineer were complimented on the generally successful completion of the work and arrangements were made for the satisfactory repair for the defective portions.

#### Sewer Connections

At the last meeting of the Council an ordinance was introduced abolishing previous provisions relative to catchbasins and cesspools on private property, and providing specifically that every residence where sewer and

water are available, shall provide modern sanitary facilities.

#### Contract Let for Water Main Extension

At the last meeting of the Board of Local Improvements the contract for the construction of a ten inch water main in Willow street from Locust to Rosewood avenues was awarded to James Viti, the low bidder on the work. This extension will be constructed in the near future as soon as the pipe can be delivered.

#### WINNETKA MAN SLIGHTLY INJURED IN AUTO CRASH

Automobiles driven by August Butzow, 827 Oak street, and John Coutre of Ridge avenue, collided at the entrance to the Indian Hill Country club Sunday. Coutre was slightly injured suffering cuts and bruises about the face and hands. The machine were considerably damaged. The accident occurred when the Butzow car, traveling south near the club grounds crashed into the Coutre machine as it emerged from the club driveway.

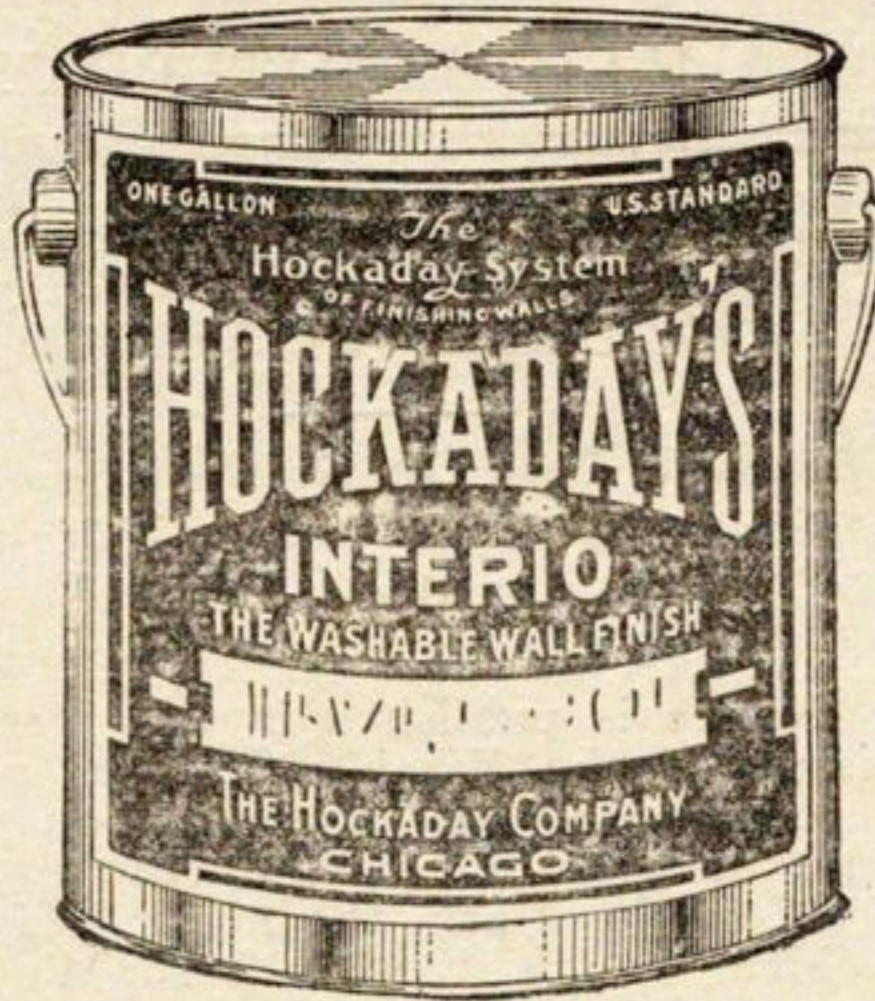
