



Activities of North Shore Clubs

ANNOUNCEMENT was made last week by Harrison B. Riley, president of the board of trustees of the Glenview Country club, whose beautiful club house, a few miles west of Evanston, was destroyed by fire last May, that the plans of the new structure, which is to take the place of the one destroyed by fire, have been received and that work on the construction on the new building began last week.

It was stated that the work on the new building was started thirty days earlier than it was originally planned. It was thought in the beginning that the actual construction of the new building could not be under way before September 1.

As was suggested a sort time after the fire which destroyed the club house, the new building will be a virtual reproduction of the old one, which had become so cherished by the members of the club.

The members had come to look on their house as a real home, one that actually looked more like a club house than it did a mausoleum. With this in mind they plan to build a house that will as nearly replace the first one as possible. Construction will be finished April 1.

There will be a dinner dance at the Skokie Country club on Saturday, August 14, at 7 o'clock. Spamer's orchestra will furnish the music. On Saturday, August 21, there will be an exhibition golf match of thirty-six holes; Vardon and Ray of England vs. "Chick" Evans and Phil Gaudins of Skokie. TOO FEW CIVIL SERVICE APPLICANTS

The Civil Service Commission invites special attention to the fact that in examinations held recently in this and other vicinities throughout the United States for calculating machine operators, operatives (card-punch machines), and telegraph operators, departmental service (Washington, D. C.), for accounting and statistical clerks, Interstate Commerce Commission, for junior engineers and deck officers, Coast and Geodetic Survey, and for deputy shipping commissioners, applicants were not secured in the number desired, and that these examinations will again be held on August 18.

Persons interested in these or other examinations should apply to the Secretary of the U. S. Civil Service Board at the local post office for detailed information and application blanks.

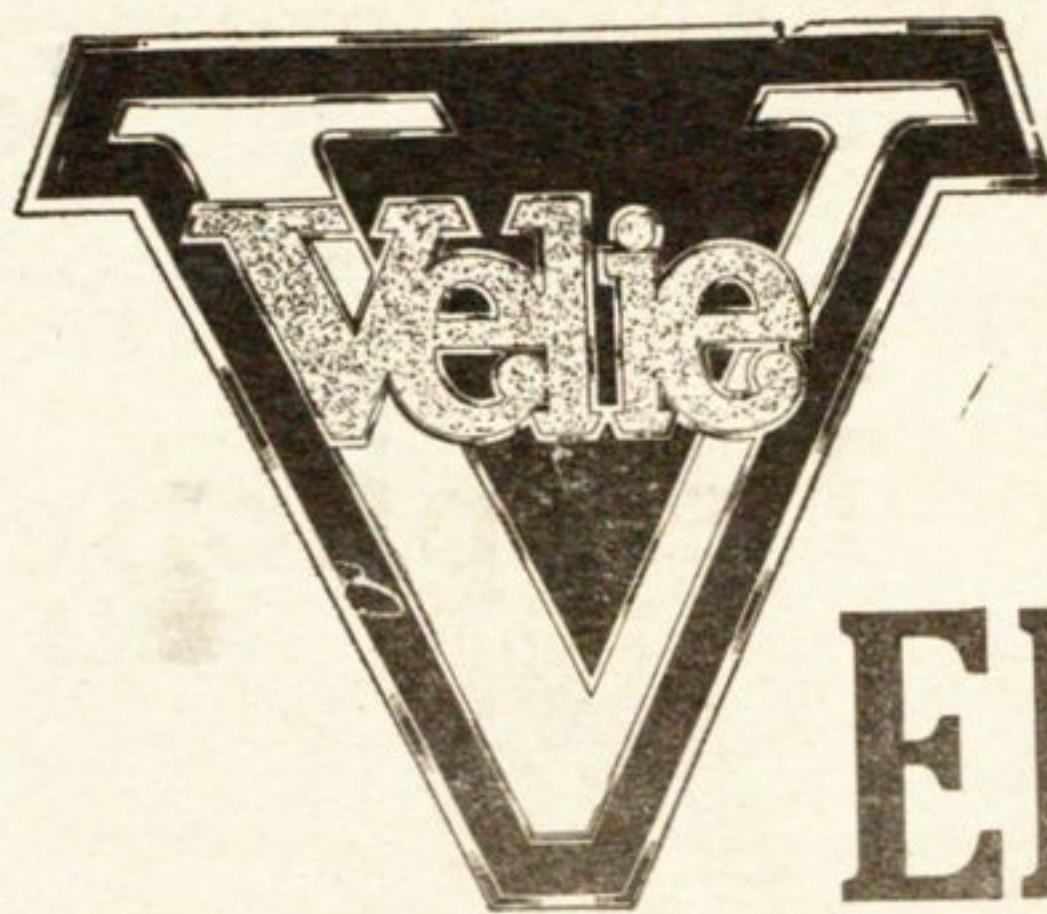

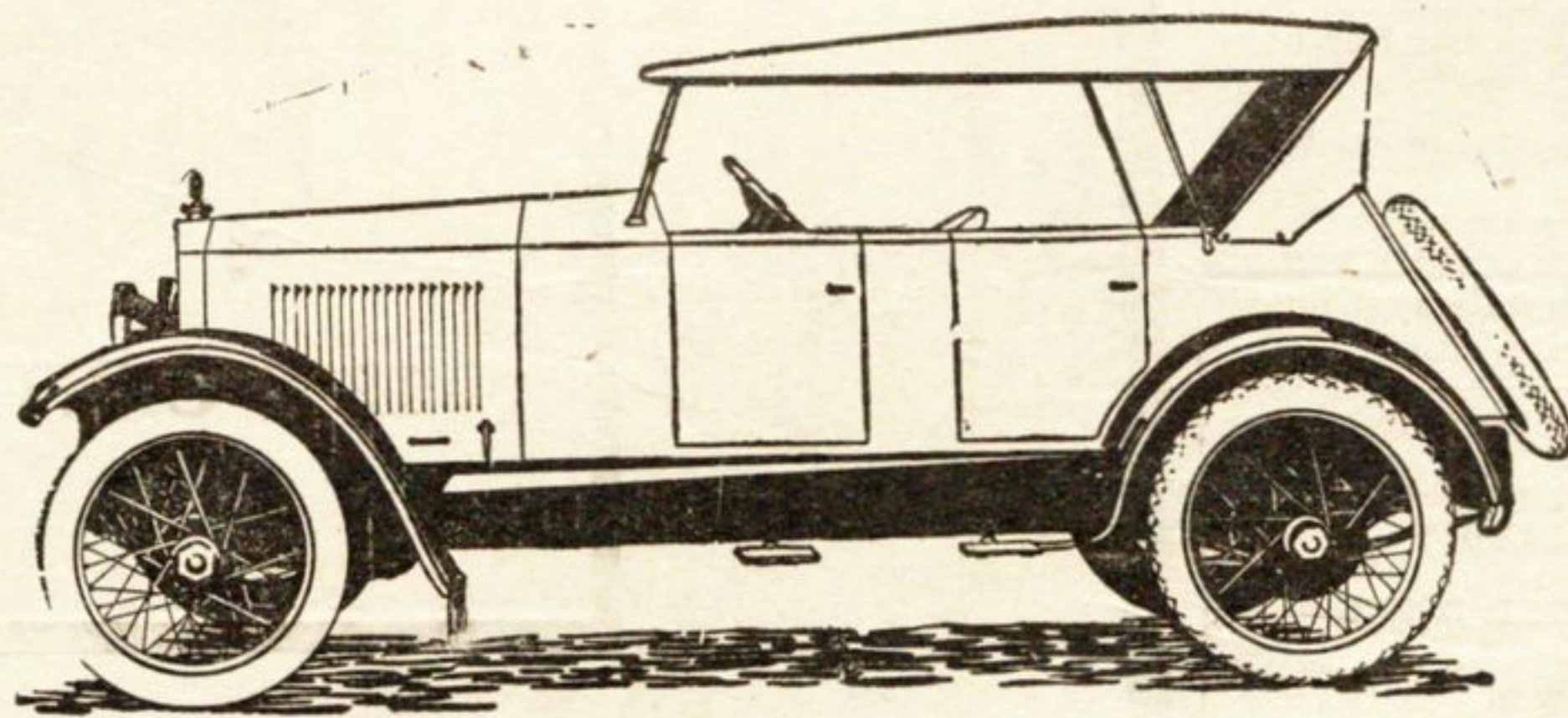

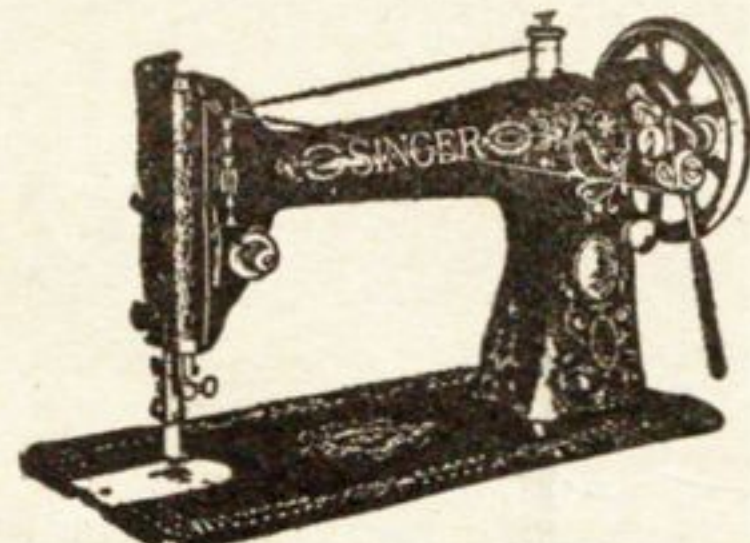
