Notice is hereby given to All Whom it May Concern, that the Winnetka Park District heretofore filed its petition in the Superior Court of Cook County, Illinois, praying for the ascertainment of the just compensation to be made for private property to be taken or damaged for use as a public park by condemning therefor the following described land, to wit:

Lots Five (5), Six (6), Seven (7) and Eight (8) in Block Four (4) in Jared Gage's Subdivision of part of the East half of the Northwest quarter, also part of the West half of the Northwest quarter, of Fractional Section Seventeen (17); also part of the East half of the Southwest quarter of Fractional Section Eight (8), all in Township Forty-two (42) North, Range Thirteen (13) East of the Third Principal Meridian, as shown upon the plat of said Subdivision recorded in the office of the Recorder of Cook County, Illinois, on the eighth day of February, A. 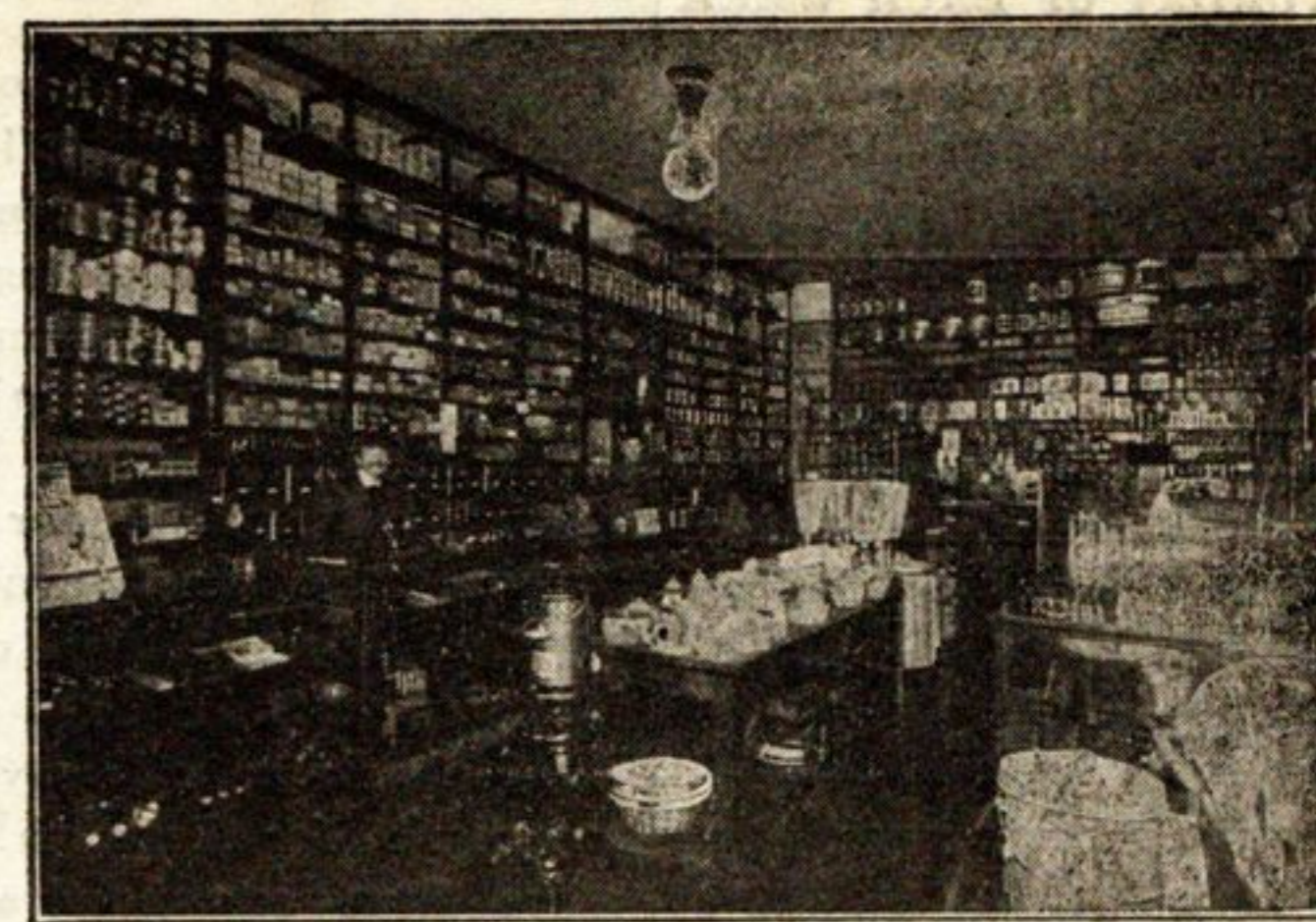
