

**Oglesby Sentiment  
Is Growing Steadily**

**Cook County Residents Arise to  
Fight Thompsonism, Leaders  
Claim**

"If there has been any question for two weeks about the nomination of John G. Oglesby for governor it was dissipated by the registration on last Wednesday."

This is the analysis of Senator C. F. Buck, campaign manager of the anti-Tammany forces, who issued a statement this week on the outlook in Illinois. Senator Buck in his statement says:

**Are Fully Aroused**

"In Chicago it was shown that citizens in large numbers, who during the past elections have failed to perform their duty as citizens by taking the time to vote, are fully aroused at this time to the pressing menace of Thompsonism."

"The registration of voters was unprecedented and this was particularly true in the large anti-Thompson wards. The women of Chicago are likewise aroused and are going to give their first demonstration of ap-

preciation of the ballot by adding their strength to this purpose. There were 127,783 women registered in Chicago Wednesday and it is most significant to the Oglesby cause.

**Unanimous for Oglesby**

"Quoting from one letter received from a central Illinois chairman: 'I have driven over the county in an effort to learn the sentiment and I am quite sure that the Republicans are almost unanimous for Oglesby.' This is the general report from these counties as we get it."

"The recent reports coming out from Chicago are to the effect that the citizens there are going to take this opportunity of shaking off the hard tribute-levying rule of the Tammany machine."

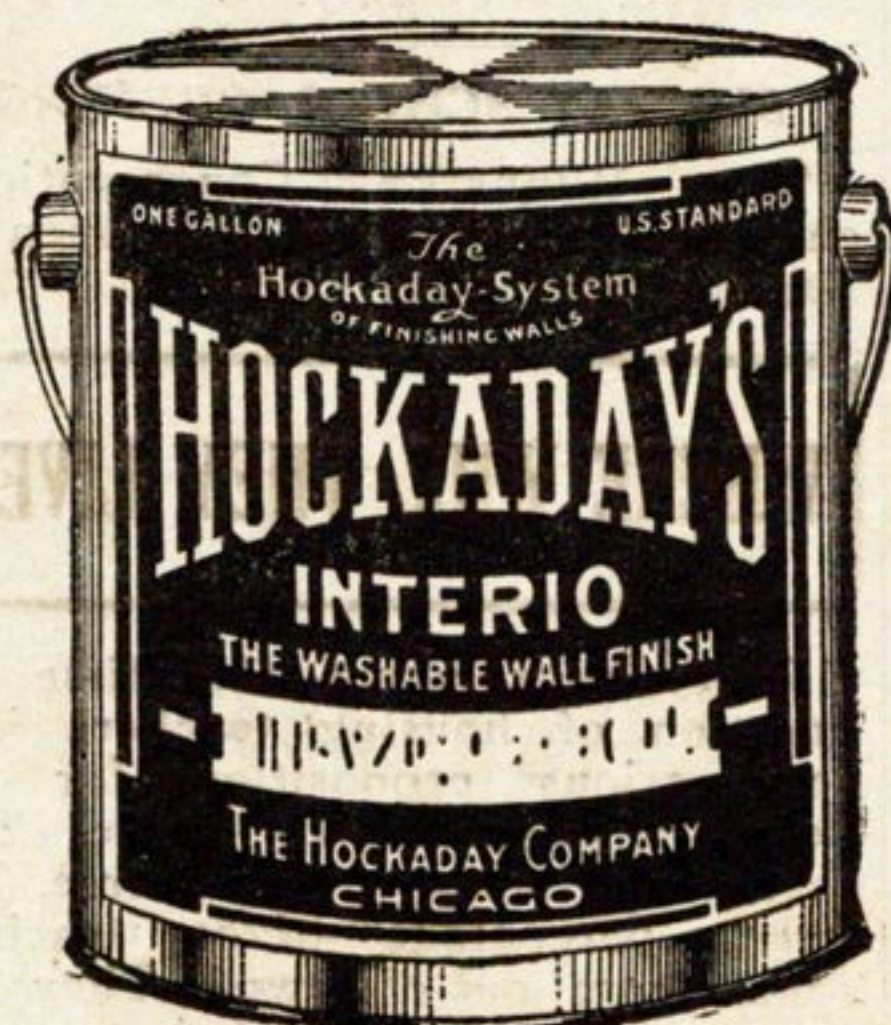
**Notice of Award of Contract**

Notice is hereby given that the contract for the construction of a connected system of water pipe in Burr Avenue, Fig Street, Rosewood Avenue, Ely Road, Locust Street, Starr Road, and the easterly and westerly private road or easement provided therefor running through Skokie View Subdivision, including all cast iron water pipe, cast iron water pipe fittings, cast iron body bronze mounted fire hydrants with cast iron body and bronze mounted auxiliary water gate valves with cast iron shut-off boxes with lids, cast iron body bronze mounted water gate valves, brick masonry water gate valve vaults with cast iron covers, connections of cast iron water pipe with necessary cast iron water pipe fittings for proposed water pipe to present water mains, and engineering and supervision during construction, all in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, said improvement and assessment being otherwise known as Winnetka Special Assessment No. 355.173, was awarded on August 18th, 1920, to Simon Ryan, 133 W. Notice is hereby given that the contract for the construction of a connected system of sanitary sewers in Fig Street, Locust Street, Pine Street, Rosewood Avenue, Ely Road, Starr Road, the easterly and westerly private road or easement provided therefor in Skokie View Subdivision, and the northerly and southerly private road or easement provided therefor in Skokie View Subdivision, including brick masonry manholes, brick masonry drop manholes, brick masonry by-pass overflow connection manholes, connection to present manhole at the intersection of Lake Street and Pine Street, vitrified, salt-glazed tile pipe sewer junctions or slants closed with vitrified tile discs, cast iron manhole covers, joints in pipe made with oakum and Portland cement mortar, galvanized wrought iron ladder rounds in manholes, restoration of present pavement where opened, backfilling trenches with sand where said trenches are opened in said present pavement; also including all trenching, backfilling surplus with earth, removal of all surplus excavated materials, and engineering and supervision during construction, all in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, said improvement and assessment being otherwise known as Winnetka Special Assessment No. 355.171, was awarded on August 18th, 1920, to James Viti & Son, 711 So.
