Nearly every day some woman telephones or goes into the Women's department of the National Republican headquarters, asking for a copy of the Susan B. Anthony Suffrage Amendment (Article 19), added to the constitution of the United States on August 26, when the state of Tennessee by its ratification of this amendment gave the women of that nation full voting privilege.

For the benefit of our women readers the resolution, short and snappy and to the point, just as written by that wonderful suffrage worker, Susan B. Anthony, is here given, reading as follows:

"Article 19: Section 1. The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be abridged or denied by the United States or by any state on account of sex.

"Sec. 2. Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation".

A Chicago woman, who has for some years been collecting the pet recipes of all the prominent women of the country, has now added one

more to her collection—the waffle recipe of Mrs. Warren Harding of Marion, Ohio, the wife of the Republican presidential nominee.

Mrs. Harding is said to bake the best waffles of any woman in the country and this is her recipe:

Two eggs, two tablespoons sugar, two heaping tablespoons butter, one pint of milk, one pint flour, two heaping teaspoons baking powder, one teaspoon salt. Beat yolks of eggs, add sugar, milk and flour; next add melted butter. Just before ready to bake add baking powder and beaten whites of eggs. Cook in hot waffle irons. Eat on empty stomach. Use plenty of butter and maple syrup.

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Preaching peace to the world, the allies are not practicing it very well among themselves. —Washington Post.

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
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
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
