Training The Boys

By state legislation all boys in New York between the ages of sixteen and nineteen must be registered for military training. The ruling is not limited to the boys in the schools, although the registration and training are a part of the school work.

In the early months of the preparation of the United States for participation in the great war appreciation of the beneficial effect of the regime in the training camp upon the physique and bearing of the young men submitted to it was very generally and enthusiastically expressed. Except for the prospect of the danger into which they were to be sent the circumstance which brought military training upon American youth was generally considered well worth what it cost, both in money and in time.

This is the benefit that is being preserved for the boys of New York. The physical training, the submission to discipline, the recognition of authority and respect for it to be gained through military training will be well worth while both to the people of the state who provide the funds for the training and to the boys who give their time to it and if there should be need for the organization of another National Army the New

York young manhood will have no reason to regret that they have been prepared for service through the course of drill and instruction to which they were required to submit themselves.

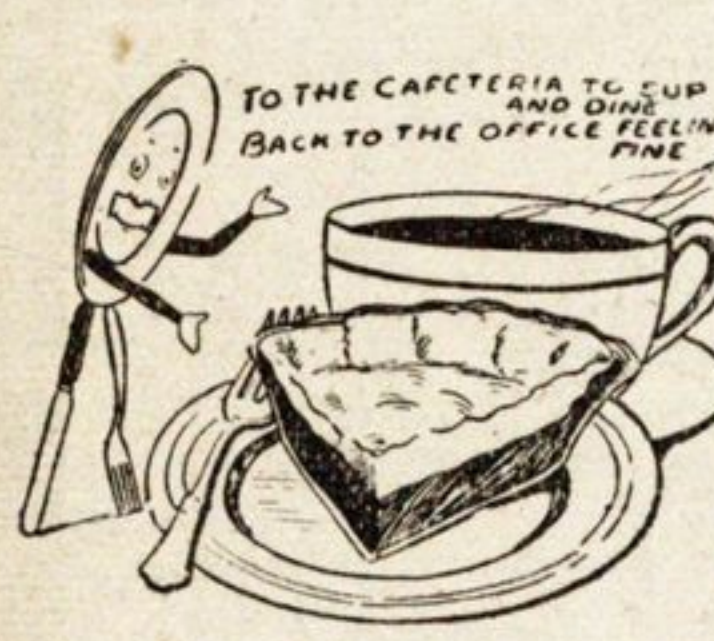
