
DR. FAY-COOPER COLE AT SUNDAY CLUB

Noted Lecturer on Philippines to Give Illustrated Talk at the Wilmette Congregational Church Sunday Evening, October 10



Illustrated by nearly one hundred beautiful stereopticon slides showing the wild tribes of the Philippines, the address of Dr. Fay-Cooper Cole of the Field Museum, at the Wilmette Sunday Evening club next Sunday evening will be one of the events of the season. Miss Gladys Swarthout will sing,

Dr. Cole has traveled into the most remote parts of the Philippines and the pictures which he will show are made from photographs which he made while on these tours. The Philippines have recently come again quite prominently into the public eye as of current importance.

Dr. Cole, having spent four years in the islands, in the interest of the Field Museum, is an acknowledged authority on this subject. He was able to get in close touch with all classes of the natives and was initiated as a member into one of the most conservative of the country, the people at work and at play, their home life and religious wild tribes. He made in all more than 4,000 pictures showing the ceremonies.


