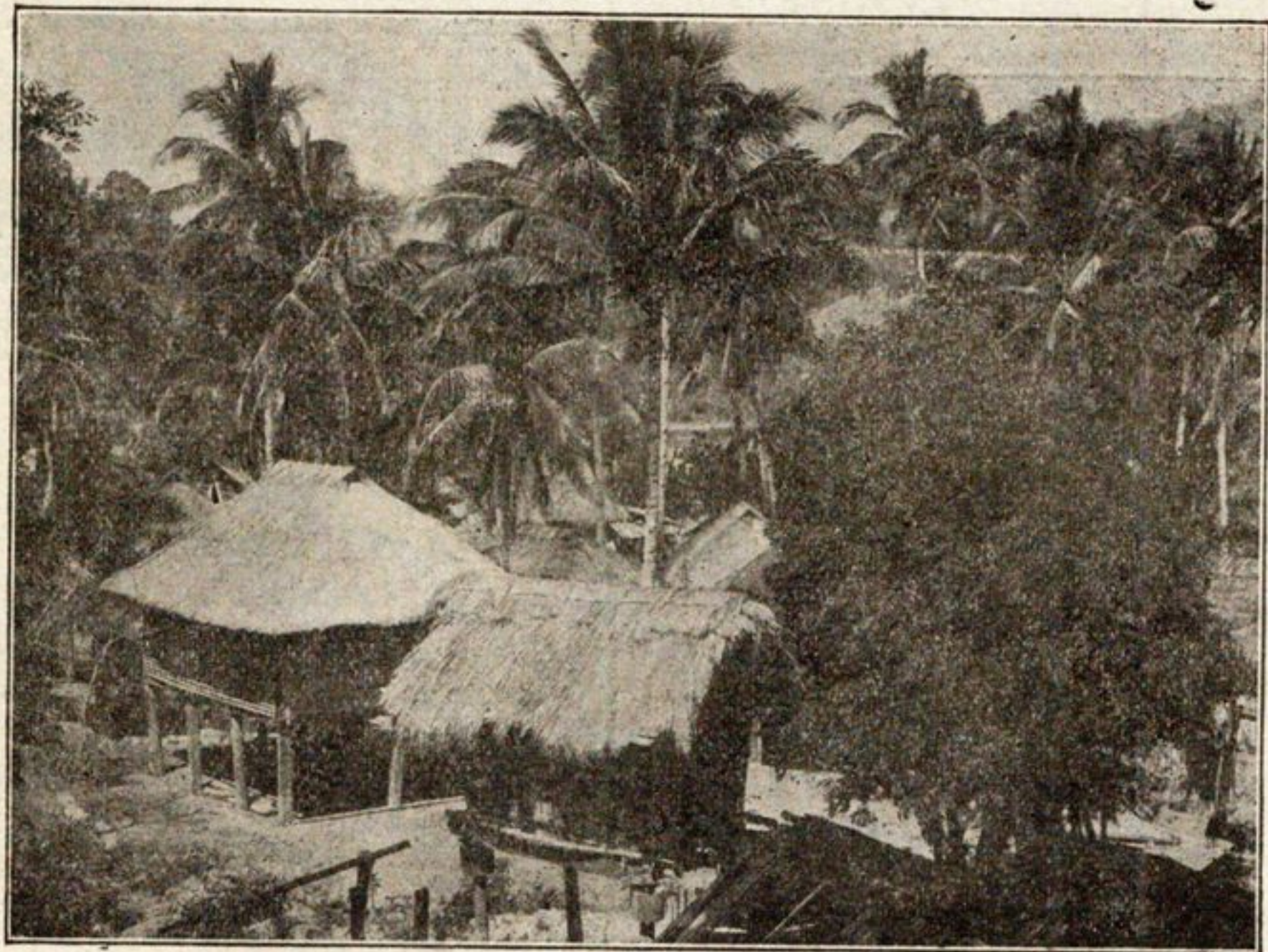


DR. FAY-COOPER COLE AT SUNDAY CLUB

Noted Lecturer on Philippines to Give Illustrated Talk at the Wilmette Congregational Church Sunday Evening, October 10



Illustrated by nearly one hundred beautiful stereopticon slides showing the wild tribes of the Philippines, the address of Dr. Fay-Cooper Cole of the Field Museum, at the Wilmette Sunday Evening club next Sunday evening will be one of the events of the season. Miss Gladys Swarthout will sing.

Dr. Cole has traveled into the most remote parts of the Philippines and the pictures which he will show are made from photographs which he made while on these tours. The Philippines have recently come again quite prominently into the public eye as of current importance.

Dr. Cole, having spent four years in the islands, in the interest of the Field Museum, is an acknowledged authority on this subject. He was able to get in close touch with all classes of the natives and was initiated as a member into one of the most conservative of the country, the people at work and at play, their home life and religious wild tribes. He made in all more than 4,000 pictures showing the ceremonies.

CHICAGO ROAD PILOT TELEGRAPHS PROGRESS

In a telegram from Minden, Nebraska, to Charles H. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor club, Charles P. Root, veteran knight of the road, logging the route from Chicago to Los Angeles for the Chicago organization, says he has averaged 189 miles per day for 756 miles covered. He is driving a Lexington and is getting 18.6 miles per gallon. Gas prices run from 29.5 to 30.75 cents per gallon. He finds that the farmers have 20 per cent of last year's crops on hand. They are long on crops and hogs, but short on cash.

ASK PROPERTY SEIZURE TO GET FRANCHISE TAXES

Illinois Secretary of State, Louis L. Emmerson, this week forwarded to the sheriffs of the respective counties warrants under Section 115 of the General Corporation Act of this state, directing them to seize and sell personal property of such defunct corporations to satisfy the amount of franchise tax due the State.

According to the records of the Corporation Department, practically all of the going concerns paid their franchise taxes during the month of July, as evidenced by the fact that Secretary of State Emmerson has collected \$2,621,095.94 in franchise taxes from corporations. Notwithstanding this fact, however, there are several thousand delinquent that will be required to pay their tax immediately to the sheriff of their respective counties or have their property seized and sold to satisfy the amount due the state.

The letter of transmittal from Mr. Emmerson to the sheriffs is as follows:

"In pursuance of the provisions of Section 116 of the General Corporation Act of this state, I am forwarding under separate cover a number of warrants for the collection of franchise taxes due from certain corporations in your county.

"It occurs to me that the stockholders of these corporations which have paid for their stock would not

"Therefore, I would suggest the importance of limiting your activities to the seizing and selling of the personal property belonging to the corporation.

"Kindly return these warrants at the earliest date possible, with the proper endorsements on the back thereof; also the amount collected from the corporation, less your statutory fees for making the collection."

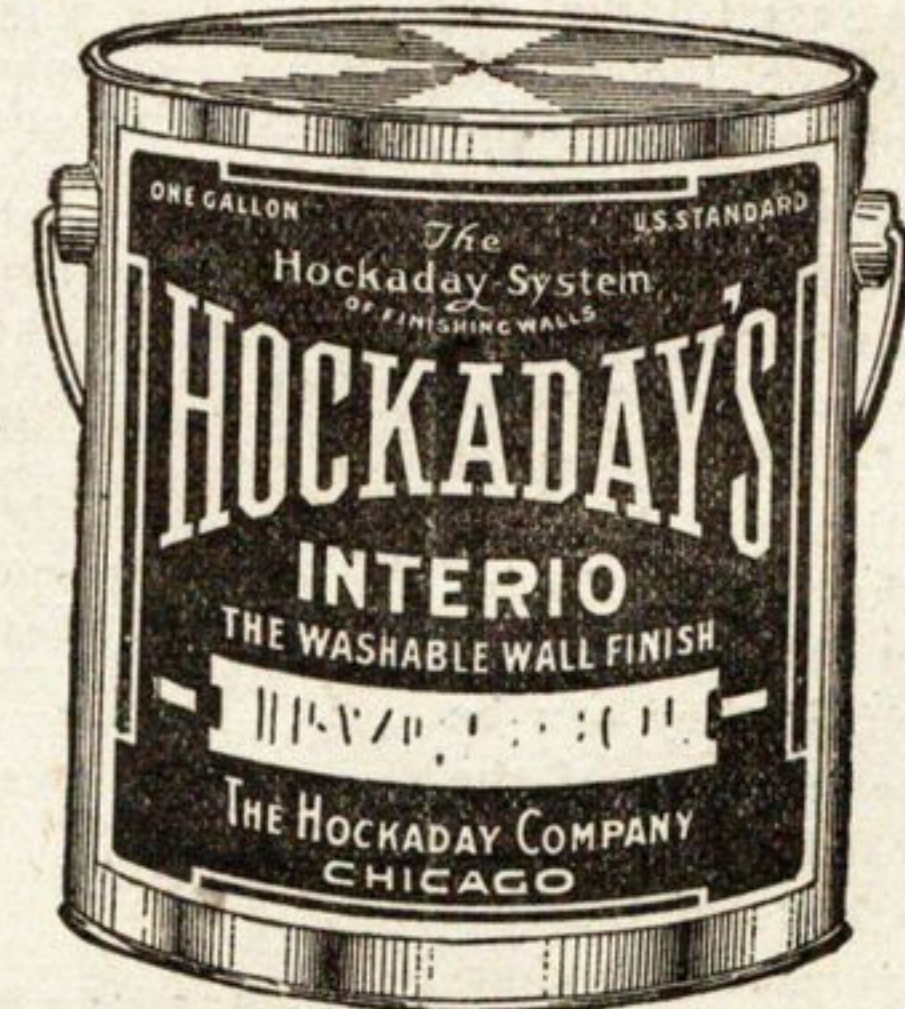
