Chicago Bar Association Endorses
FRANCIS X. BUSCH
For County Judge
By a Vote of 1287 to 342 for His Opponent



Following out a long established custom, the Chicago Bar Association, composed of more than two-thirds of the active practicing members of the Cook County Bar, held a primary of its members on the judicial offices to be filled at the coming election.

Interest centered principally upon the office of Judge of the County Court, because of the outstanding importance of that office, controlling, as it does, the Election machinery of Chicago and Cicero, and including in its jurisdiction the supervision of the Psychopathic hospital and the exclusive hearing of taxation and special assessment cases.

Francis X. Busch, the Democratic candidate received 1287 votes, as against 342 votes cast for his Thompson-Lundin opponent.

When it is considered that the membership of the Chicago Bar Association is overwhelmingly Republican on national questions, the emphatic endorsement of Mr. Busch is an unanswerable argument in favor of his election to the County bench.
