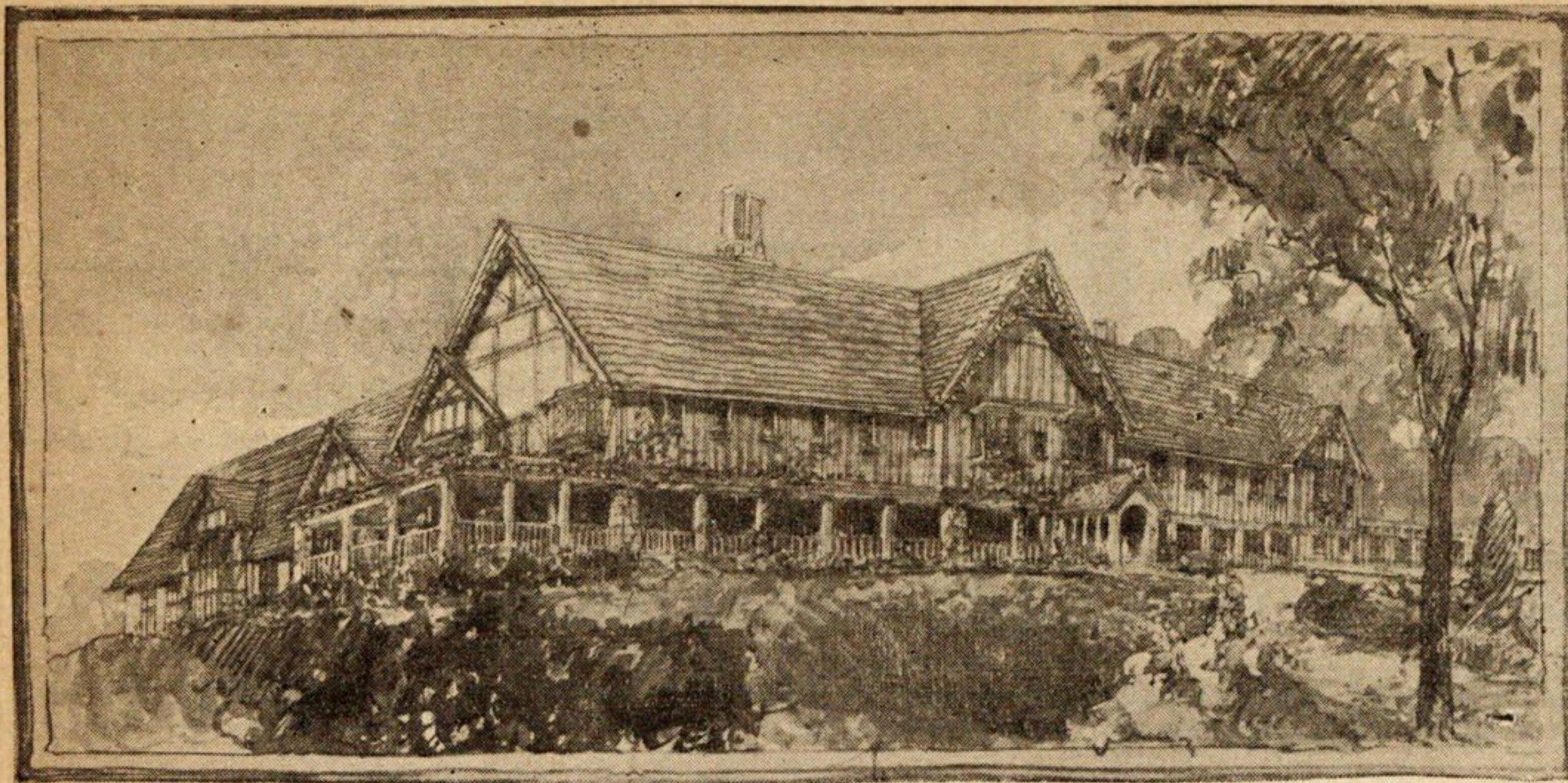


## PROPOSED NEW GLENVIEW GOLF CLUB HOUSE



Standing practically on the site of the old clubhouse and following the plan of hominess and inviting rusticity which endeared the old to the hearts of the club members, the new Glenview Golf club clubhouse, has come in plan form from the hands of the architects and has been submitted to the members for their approval. Timber and plaster construction

which is to be used gives the clubhouse an appearance in harmony with the grounds and assures that the building will be entirely fireproof. The interior, with the kitchen, dining room, living rooms, halls and parlors, is much in the same arrangement as in the old club. On the second floor there will be ten sleeping rooms for the accommodation of the members. Probably the most distinctive and

inviting feature of the building will be the roomy covered porch, which extends the entire length of the building and is continued beyond it to the south for about half the length of the grounds. The building will face almost directly west. The estimated cost of the building alone is estimated \$250,000. The furniture and improvement of the grounds will add another \$5,000 or \$10,000 to the total cost.

### HOLD GOVERNMENT CLASS FOR WOMEN OF NEW TRIER

New Trier Township Government class, conducted by Mrs. Kenneth Rich of Hull House, Chicago, meets every Monday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock, at the Winnetka Woman's club house. This class is not exclusively for club members but is intended for every woman in the township. Women are asking so many questions about the political machinery of the city, state and county and are in many cases getting unsatisfactory answers to their questions.

"Set aside the next three Mondays at 1:30 o'clock and attend these lessons, so that you may be better informed about matters that every intelligent citizen should know," say the leaders of the class.

"It would seem from the small number of women who voted at the primary election on September 16," they conclude, "that many of our Winnetka women are not yet fully awake to their individual responsibility as citizens. Every woman should consider her voting not only as a privilege but as a duty and should let nothing prevent her going to the polls and expressing herself there in the name of good government."

### LEGION TO ASK ALL EX-SERVICE MEN REINSTATE

Officers Prepared To Assist in Every Way To Insure Protection of World War Fighters

The state of Illinois sent 320,000 men into the military service during the world war. All of these men carried Government insurance while in the service but since their discharge three-fourths of that number, not knowing the value of that insurance, have allowed it to lapse and today are ignorant as to their rights regarding reinstatement.

The insurance dropped amounts to over one and one-half billion dollars. Under the supervision of the Bureau of War Risk Insurance Representative E. V. Dickson, of Chicago, the American Legion will conduct an intensive campaign during the next three months in an endeavor to have all ex-service men who have allowed their insurance to lapse reinstated.

"Now, fellows," reads an official statement, "a great many of you took out insurance against your will while in the service, but this was one time the government was right. You needed the protection and you were given it at a very cheap rate. Since you have returned from the service you need the protection more than ever and you still get the advantage of the same low rate."

"The men in charge of the American Legion Posts will be glad to explain the benefit of Government Insurance to you, if you will only give them a chance. If you haven't reinstated your insurance call at once at the American Legion post and talk it over with them. They can prove to you that it is the best, safest and cheapest insurance you can possibly buy."

### POLICE CHIEF CAPTURES COPPERS' "GUN" CONTEST

Chief of police Peterson, accompanied by policeman Hanselman and Balkow journeyed to the North avenue shore Thursday afternoon for a

Contractors will be paid in bonds bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum for all estimates approved by the Board of Local Improvements in the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and over, from the second and subsequent installments of said Special Assessment, and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is more than the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and no further bonds may be issued against the second

and subsequent installments of said Special Assessment, and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is less than the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), the same will be paid by time warrants.

In addition to the usual bond for construction and maintenance in the sum equal to the amount of the bid accepted by the Board of Local Improvements, the successful bidder will be required to furnish an indemnity and defense policy in some reliable company, indemnifying the Village of Winnetka against loss from liability for damages on account of injury or death suffered by reason of the performance of the work required to be performed by the said contractor, by any person or persons, including such liability imposed under the employers' liability and workmen's compensation law of the State of Illinois, and the amendments thereof, in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).

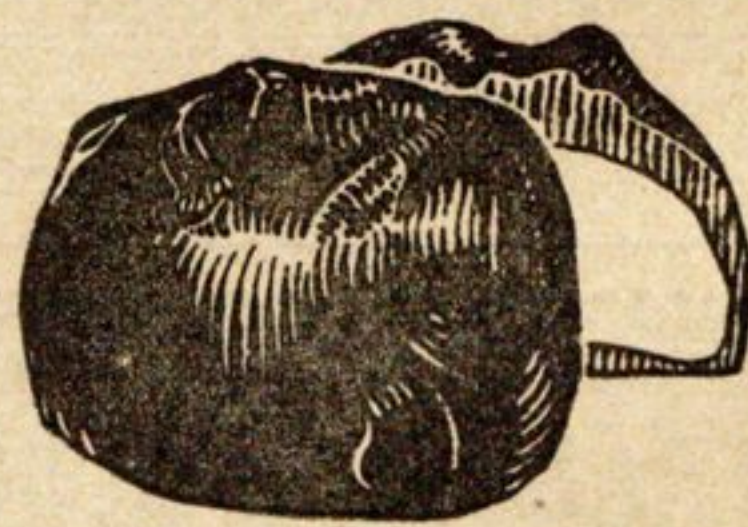
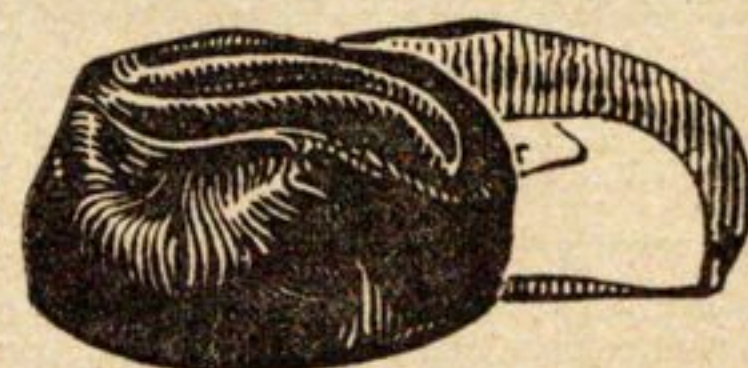

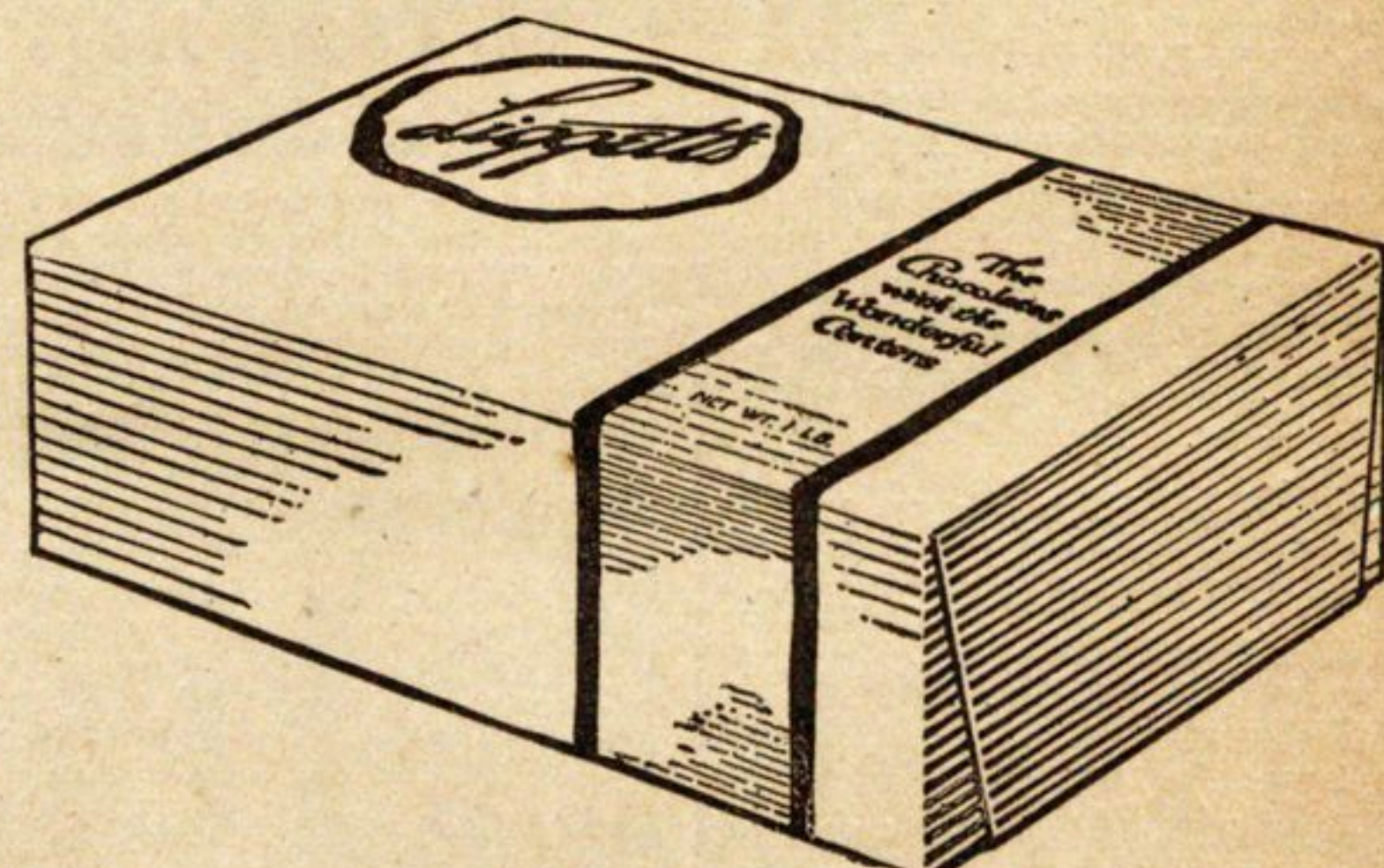
