For the construction of a vitrified, glazed tile pipe sanitary sewer, including brick masonry manholes with cast iron covers, vitrified tile pipe drop connections encased in concrete, vitrified tile pipe house slants closed with vitrified tile discs, in ELM STREET from and connecting with the present sanitary sewer at the intersection of Elm Street and Berkeley Avenue, east in Elm Street, and connecting with the present sanitary sewer at the intersection of Elm Street with Glendale Avenue, in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, said improvement and assessment being otherwise known as Winnetka Special Assessment No. 351,467, in accordance with the ordinance heretofore passed therefor, will be received by the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Winnetka by or before eight o'clock P. M., on Tuesday, the twenty-third day of November, A. D. 1920, at which hour all bids will be opened at a meeting to be held in the Council Chamber of the Village Hall, in said Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois.

The specifications of said improvement are on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village of Winnetka. Contractors will be paid in bonds

bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum for all estimates approved by the Board of Local Improvements in the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and over, from and second and subsequent installments of said Special Assessment, and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is more than the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and no further bonds may be issued against the second and subsequent installments of said Special Assessment, and when the amount of balance due on any estimate is less than the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), the same will be paid by time warrants.

In addition to the usual bond for construction and maintenance in the sum equal to the amount of the bid accepted by the Board of Local Improvements, the successful bidder will be required to furnish an indemnity and defense policy in some reliable company, indemnifying the Village of Winnetka against loss from liability for damages on account of injury or death suffered by reason of the performance of the work required to be performed by the said contractor, by any person or person including such liability imposed under the employers' liability and workmen's compensation law of the State of Illinois, and the amendments thereof, in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).
