DANIELS SEES U. S. AS WORLD'S LEADING NAVAL POWER IN 1923

Washington.—The United States will be the major naval power in the world in 1923 unless great Britain makes changes in her naval program, Secretary of the Navy Daniels said today in commenting on press dispatches that Great Britain has deferred her program of capital ship construction until the entire question of naval strength is settled.

Secretary Daniels stated he was interested in reported agitation in England for a navy equal to the combined strength of the United States and Japan navies. He said he would discuss this question with the house naval affairs committee next week when he appears to take up the question of the American naval program.
