Thus the old fight between civic beauty and commercialism appears to be again under way, and, judging by the tenor of the association's meeting, there is little doubt as to which will prevail.

After the business session the gathering was favored with two delightful evidences of Indian Hill talent. Mrs. A. B. Cooley, and Mr. S. B. Orwig each sang four songs which were greatly appreciated by the audience. The evenings' entertainment was rounded off by dancing and by all present getting better acquainted.

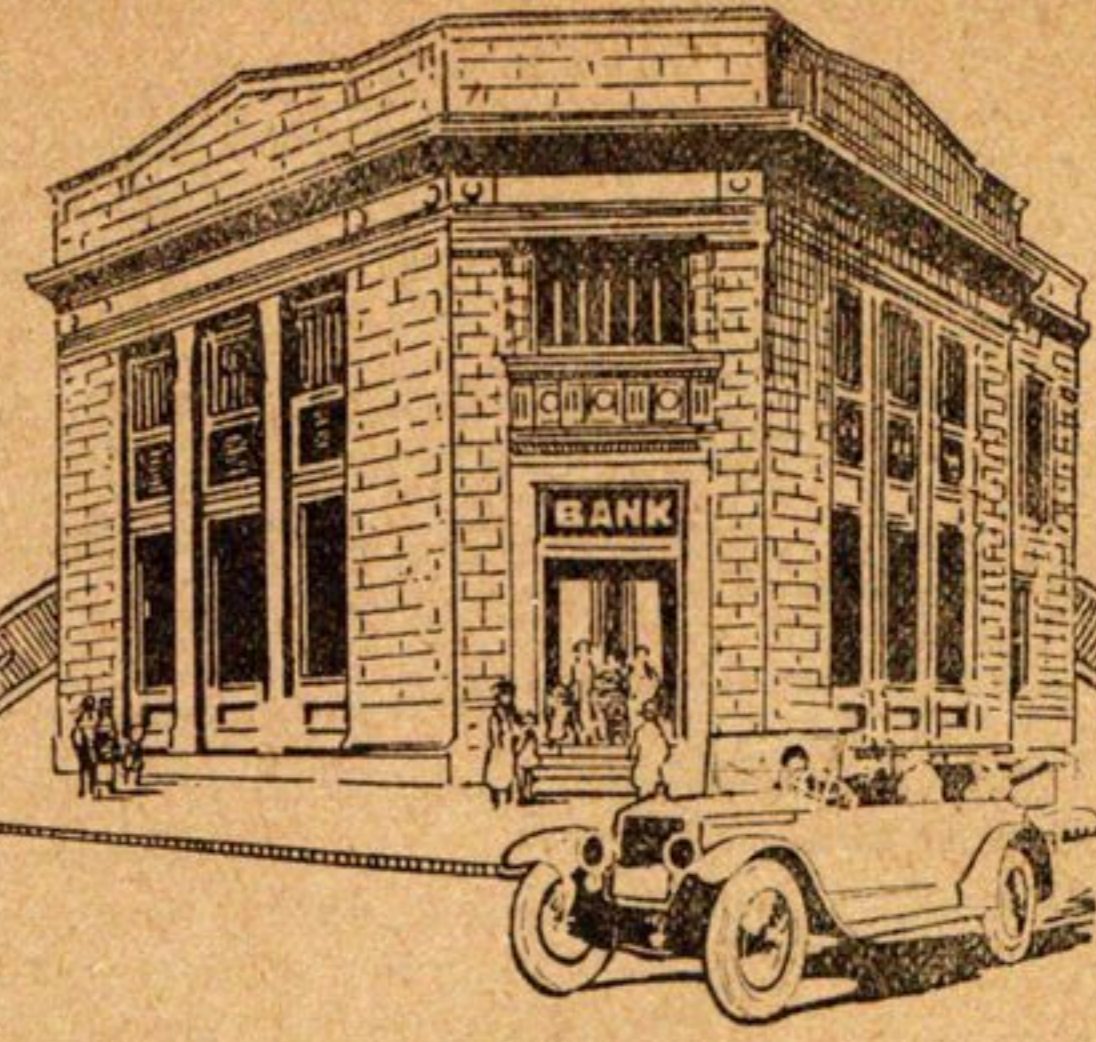

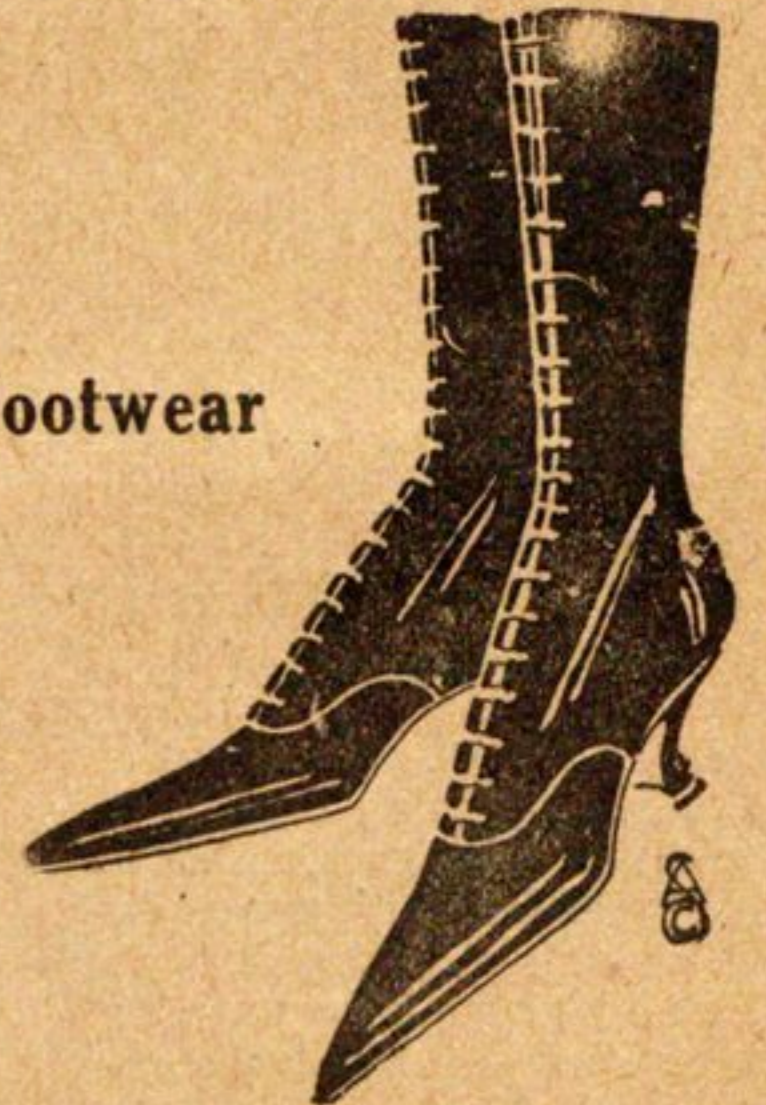
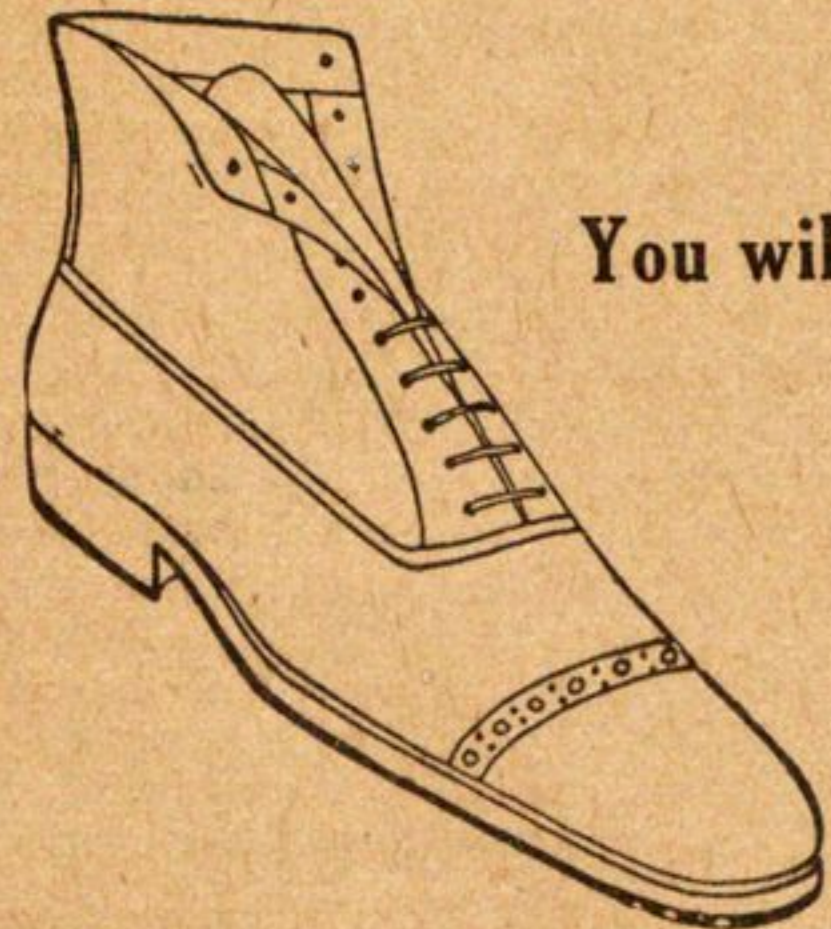
