RAILROADS WELCOME COMPETITION WITH MOTOR TRANSPORTS

Railroads welcome the motor truck, according to the well-known "Rail- road Review." This will be interesting news to the motor truck manufactur- ing interests. There has been re- ported in the past an apparent atti- tude of antagonism toward the com- mercial car in general. It has been claimed that where good roads were general the truck was cutting into the tonnage of the railroads. "There was some reason for the general comment regarding the antagonistic feeling of the rail- roads for the motor truck," said W. G. Rath, of Napoleon Motors com- pany, Traverse City Mich., "for wherever any section such as Cali- fornia possessed ideal highways in great system, making possible a wide-spread transportation of freight without resource to railroads the loss to the railroads in freight haulage was considerable. "It is in cases where long distance hauling is possible that the railroads suffer. The latter now recognize that the economy in the use of motor trucks over moderate distances is not to be questioned. They are unwilling to grant the economy of truck transportation for long distances, and their antagonism in districts

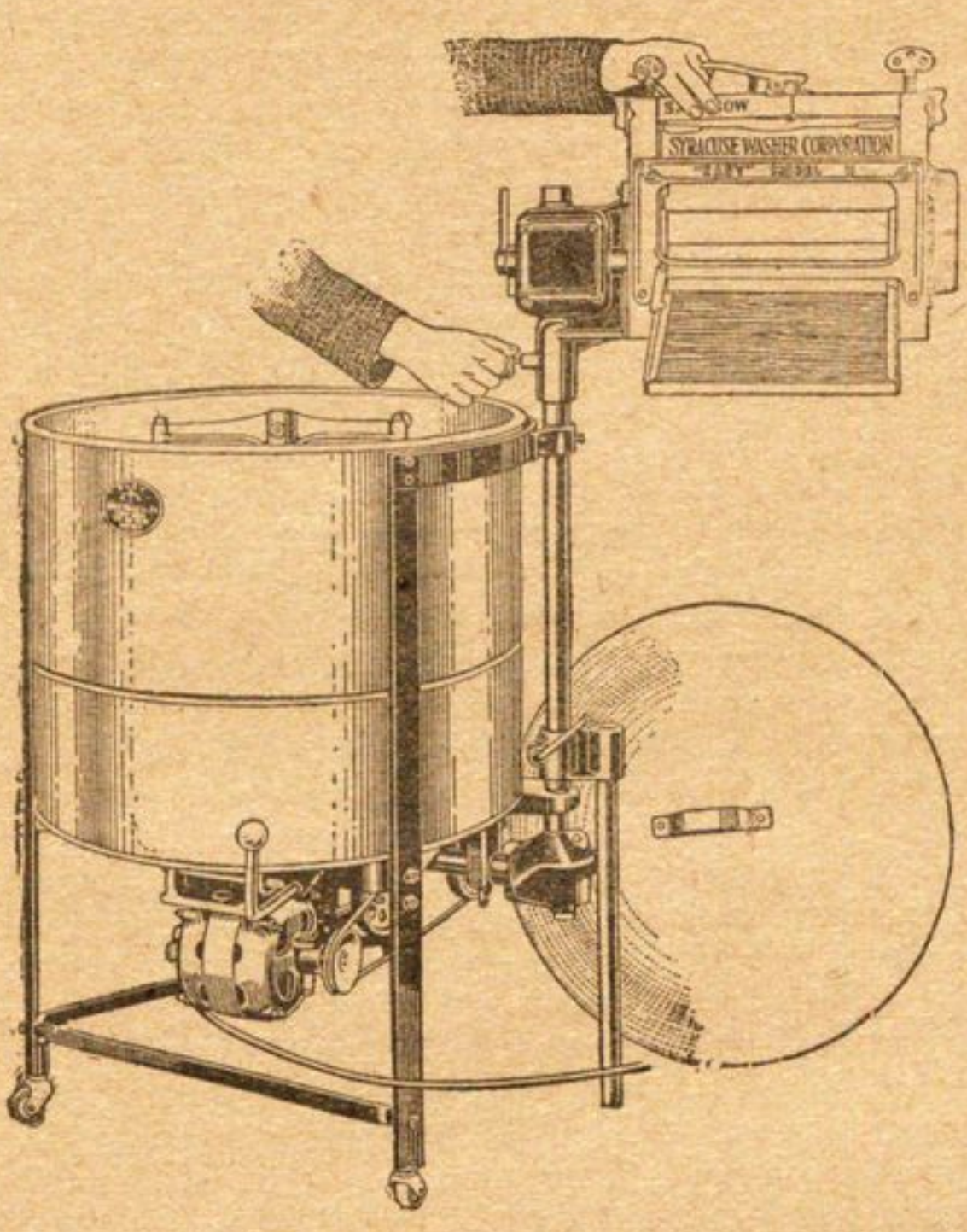
where this is possible has hardly been questioned in the past. With the great additions planned to Am- erican highway systems throughout the country there can be no doubt

that the railways will suffer a decline in business as the truck will prove much more economical, both in time and in handling of the goods."
