

**TOPPINGTON GOLF COURSE  
LATEST ON NORTH SHORE**

There is an organized movement to build a modern golf course and club house in the immediate vicinity of Libertyville. After many meetings and considerable controversy concerning the purchase of land in this section of the country suitable for golf course purposes; and during the course of much conjecture and speculation relative thereto, several unusual tracts in and adjacent to Libertyville were seriously considered.

At a recent conference, however, which was incidentally marked by an atmosphere of finality and completeness, negotiations were practically completed whereby the organizers of Toppington managed to secure a lease embracing 137 acres of the G. T. Pushman estate with an option to purchase. Plans which are declared to be the most original and complete ever devised for successfully financing a golf club, have been agreed upon, and the organizers are now busily engaged in securing members. Many prominent residents of the north shore colony and Chicago have become interested in this new organization and a partial list of those actively engaged will be offered for publication shortly.

The drive is on, and with human dynamism of nervous energy, dominating an intensified spirit that will eventually attach itself to the civic pride of the townspeople of Libertyville, and the north shore, the new Toppington project bids fare to occupy an enviable stellar position in golfdom.

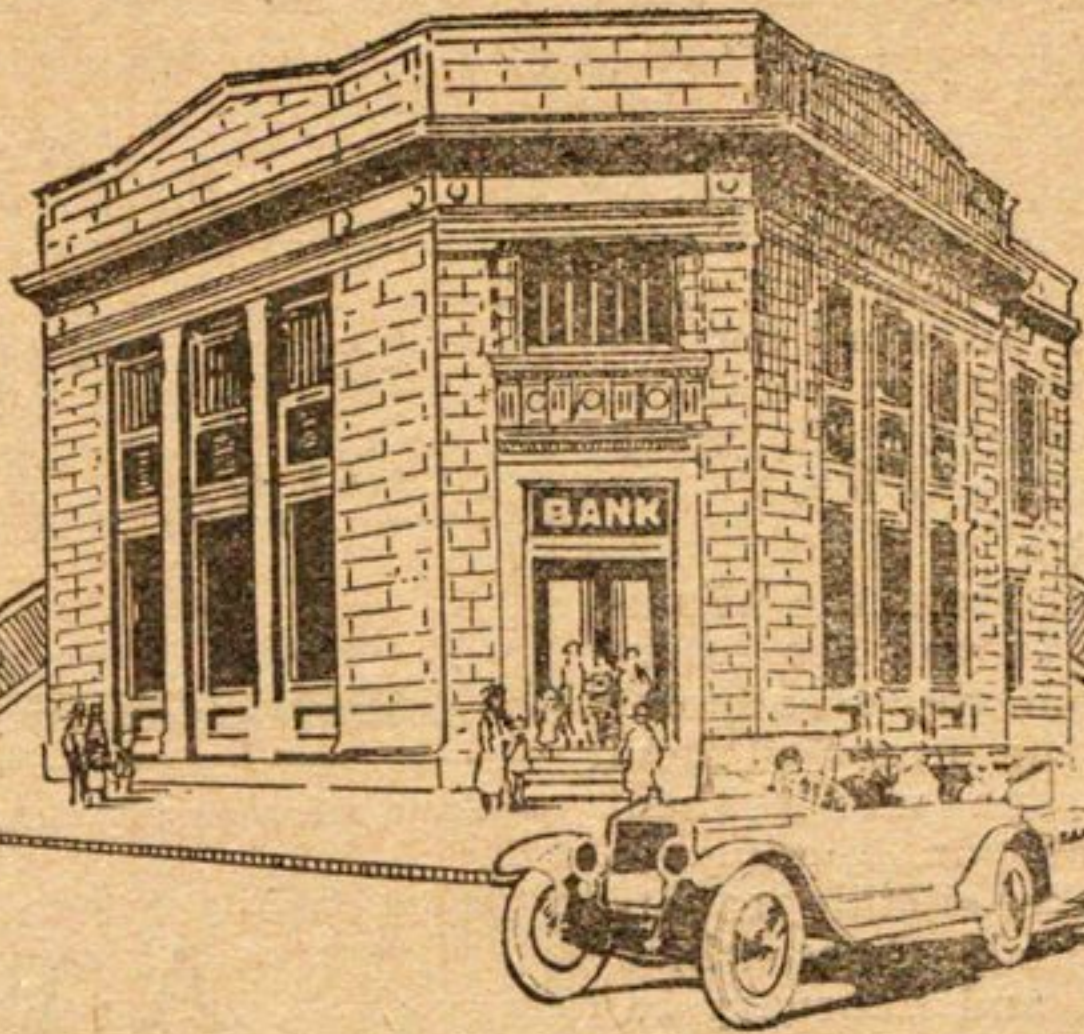
find in this subject much that is of great interest.

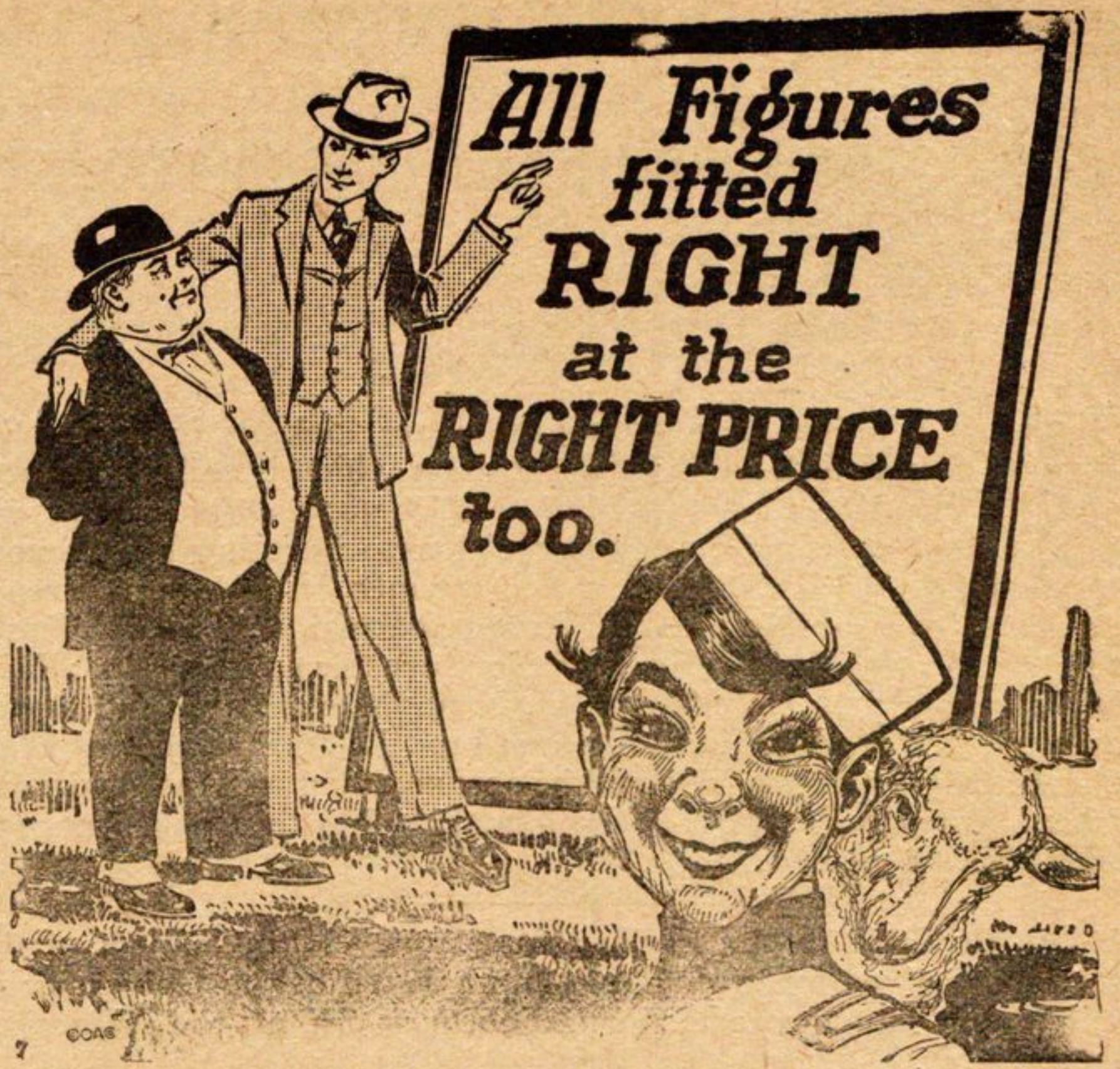
