**ROADS OUT OF CHICAGO  
FOUND IN GOOD SHAPE**

**Survey Shows Automobile Highways Leading From This Vicinity, In Exceptional Condition**

Roads leading out of Chicago are in a good condition; dirt roads are drying out and will be in a very good shape if the weather continues favorably.  
 The detour between Lyons and La Grange, Illinois, on Ogden avenue, is in a very poor shape.  
 The Dixie Highway between Chicago and Danville is in a splendid shape with the exception of the detour just north of Waukegan. The bridge is out and the detour is a mud road, very bad.  
 Route No. 10 from Danville to Decatur is very good except the mud road between Fithian and Urbana, which is almost impassable. Bad stretches improving.  
 Roads radiating from Springfield are slowly drying and will be in a passable condition in a few days under the present weather. Practically all dirt and gravel roads in the central part of Illinois.  
 Missouri roads are drying very rapidly; practically all dirt roads and they have been quite muddy and difficult; in some places impassible.  
 Road conditions in Iowa are fair to good; rapidly improving; no snow and rough stretches are gradually smoothing out.  
 Nebraska roads are thawing after the heavy snow, muddy and rough in places. In the western parts the roads are very bad.  
 Roads in the vicinity of Dallas, Texas are dry but rough. Sherman to Dallas under construction; Eufaula to Durant, Okla., very bad. The Ozarks Trail from Las Vegas to Amarillo, Texas, is in a good condition. The National Old Trails north and south of Las Vegas is fair to good. Snow has been reported on the National Old Trails throughout Trinidad, Colorado.

**FUJI-YAMA AWAKES




