

**WATCH YOUR RUBBISH FIRES
WARNING OF CHIEF HOUREN**

"Too much care cannot be taken in preventing spread of rubbish fires," said Fire Chief G. M. Houren this week, in commenting on the number of brush fires in Winnetka this week. "Residents should avoid burning rubbish, even in containers, on windy days, and should at all times stay with the fires until they are out," he advised.

Four brush fires in the village this week were all occasioned by the spread of smoldering or wind-blown rubbish fires, it was said. Two brush fire calls came on Tuesday, one near 738 Linden avenue and a second at North and Vernon avenues. On Wednesday there were brush fires at 915 Euclid avenue and at 618 Willow street.

A roof fire at the home of H. S. DeLay, 878 Oak street, caused \$50 damage Tuesday, the blaze being caused by sparks from a chimney. On Wednesday there was a fire call

to the home of Edward Flynn, 564 Center street. An overheated stove occasioned alarm. There was no damage.
