
Miles was peeved but nevertheless was taken to the court of Magistrate D. M. Mickey. The fine was \$10 and costs on each of a pair of charges.

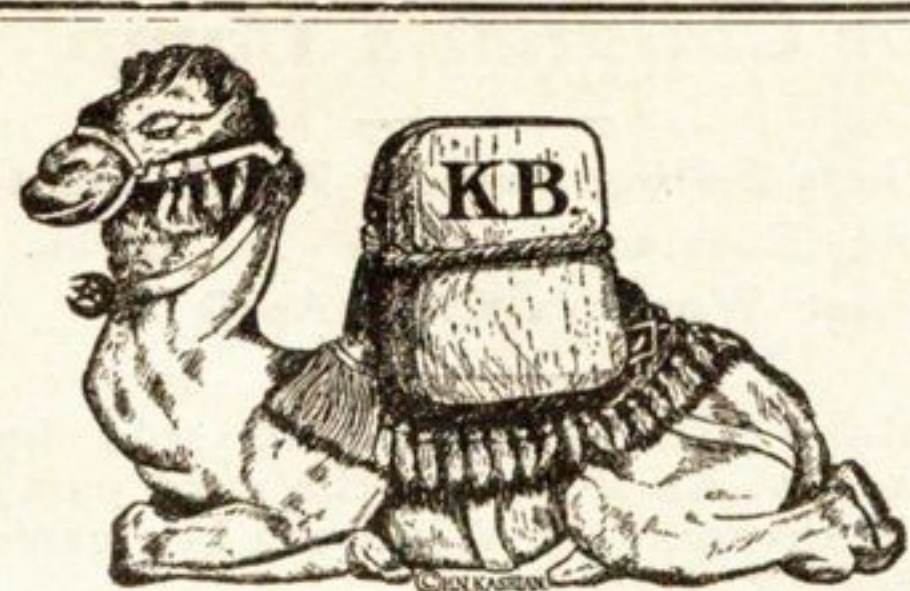

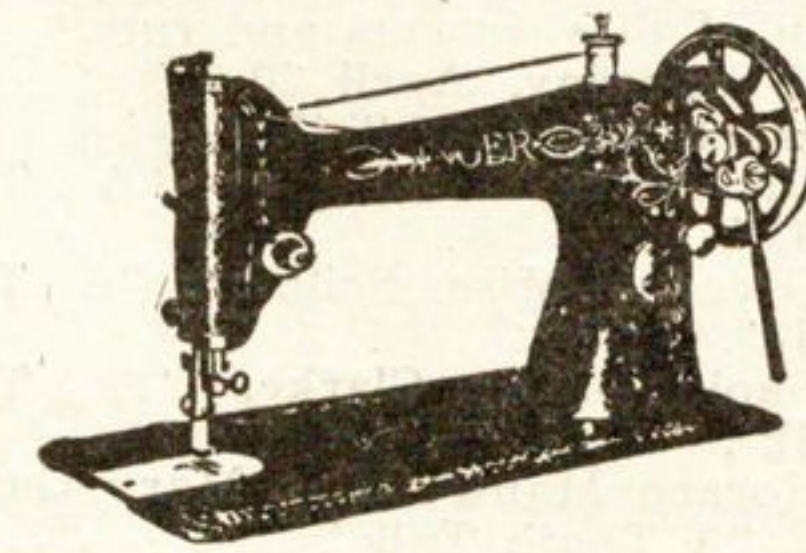
