Mrs. Francis Peabody Butler, of 777 Bryant avenue, is enjoying some riding and golf at Virginia Hot Springs, these days.

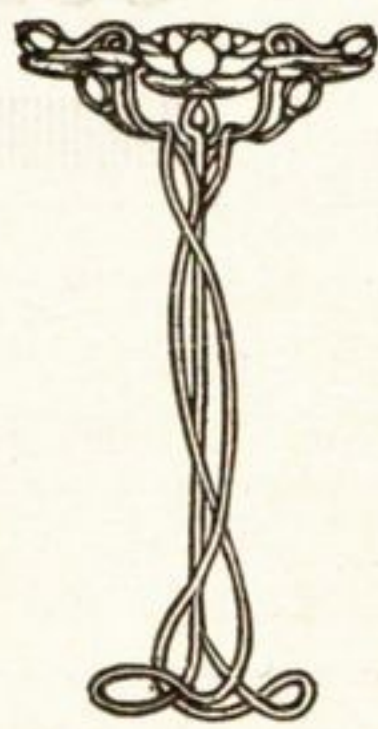
