The guardianship of children and unification of laws concerning women was dealt with by Mrs. Catharine Waugh McCulloch in her address made before the first conference of the second annual convention of the National League of Women Voters, being held at Cleveland, O., on April

Mrs. McCulloch has drawn up a suggestion for a model guardianship law, which she presented at the conference, and under which the wife and husband would be joint natural guardians of their minor children until the death of either parent, when guardianship would revert to the surviving parent. In case of divorce or legal separation the state might award the guardianship to either parent.


Mrs. McCulloch will also take up the subject of uniform laws concerning women. She believes that women should be subject to jury service;




