



Activities of North Shore Clubs

WILMETTE WOMAN'S CLUB will hold its annual meeting and election of officers on Wednesday afternoon, April 20. An interesting feature of this meeting is the address on "Community Service," to be given by Mrs. George W. Plummer of Chicago, corresponding secretary of the General federation. Hostesses for the afternoon will be Mesdames Edward Colby, H. R. Hitchcock and Walter G. Moore.

The annual luncheon and meeting of the Winnetka Woman's club will be held on Thursday, April 21, at the clubhouse. The election of officers for the ensuing year, and the reading of the annual reports will take place at this meeting.

The Delta Gamma sorority of Northwestern university has been granted the exclusive cafe privileges of the Community Golf clubhouse for the season. The announcement followed on the heels of the report by William L. Goodwin, chairman of the house of committee that the picturesque Northmoor retreat had been taken over by the community association.

The clubhouse will be maintained as a tearoom and will be opened not only to members of the association, but to the public. An attractive sign at the gatepost will tell passersby that the "Anchor Inn" will welcome them to its hospitable walls. Appetizing luncheons will be served during the day and it is also being planned by the sorority to have dancing and refreshments during the evening. The clubhouse will be rented out for evening parties to the public and the sorority will have all the refreshment privileges of the golf course, including the soft drinks at both starting houses. The proceeds of their endeavor will be added to their building fund for a new chapter house in Evanston.

Although the golf and tennis privileges of the club will be confined to Evanston and Wilmette residents, "Anchor Inn" will be open to anyone. Many of the most public-spirited women of the north shore are enthusiastic over the enterprise and are making elaborate preparations for the refurbishing and decorating of the clubhouse prior to its opening on May 2. Mrs. Herbert Pope, general chairman of the Delta Gamma sorority, will be in charge of the arrangements. Assisting her is the business manager, Mrs. Walter S. Vose and Miss Catherine Jenkins, assistant manager. Anchor Inn will be the new nineteenth hole of the community golf links and will be one of the attractive features of the summer in connection with the activities of the club.

The guardianship of children and unification of laws concerning women was dealt with by Mrs. Catharine Waugh McCulloch in her address made before the first conference of the second annual convention of the National League of Women Voters, being held at Cleveland, O., on April 11.

Mrs. McCulloch has drawn up a suggestion for a model guardianship law, which she presented at the conference, and under which the wife and husband would be joint natural guardians of their minor children until the death of either parent, when guardianship would revert to the surviving parent. In case of divorce or legal separation the state might award the guardianship to either parent.

Mrs. McCulloch will also take up the subject of uniform laws concerning women. She believes that women should be subject to jury service;

that they should be called as jurors on their merits as citizens, not because they are women, and that they should be called to serve on mixed juries rather than juries composed entirely of women. Just civil service laws for men and women; mothers' pensions of adequate and definite amount and laws concerning marriage and divorce will be discussed by Mrs. McCulloch.

The object of the session, according to the program, is "to improve laws concerning women and to make uniform these laws in the various states." The conference opened at 10 a. m. with addresses of welcome. A response to these were made by Miss Esther Dunshee of Wilmette, who is president of the Illinois Woman's Bar association. Miss Dunshee also spoke Monday evening.

Among other north shore women who are attending the convention are Mrs. Harold Ickes and Mrs. James F. Porter.

The North Shore Alumnae association of the Delta Delta Delta sorority held its regular monthly luncheon Wednesday at the home of Mrs. George Roehm in Winnetka.

Mr. David R. Forgan was the speaker at the meeting of the Woman's Library club of Glencoe on Thursday his subject being "Investments."
