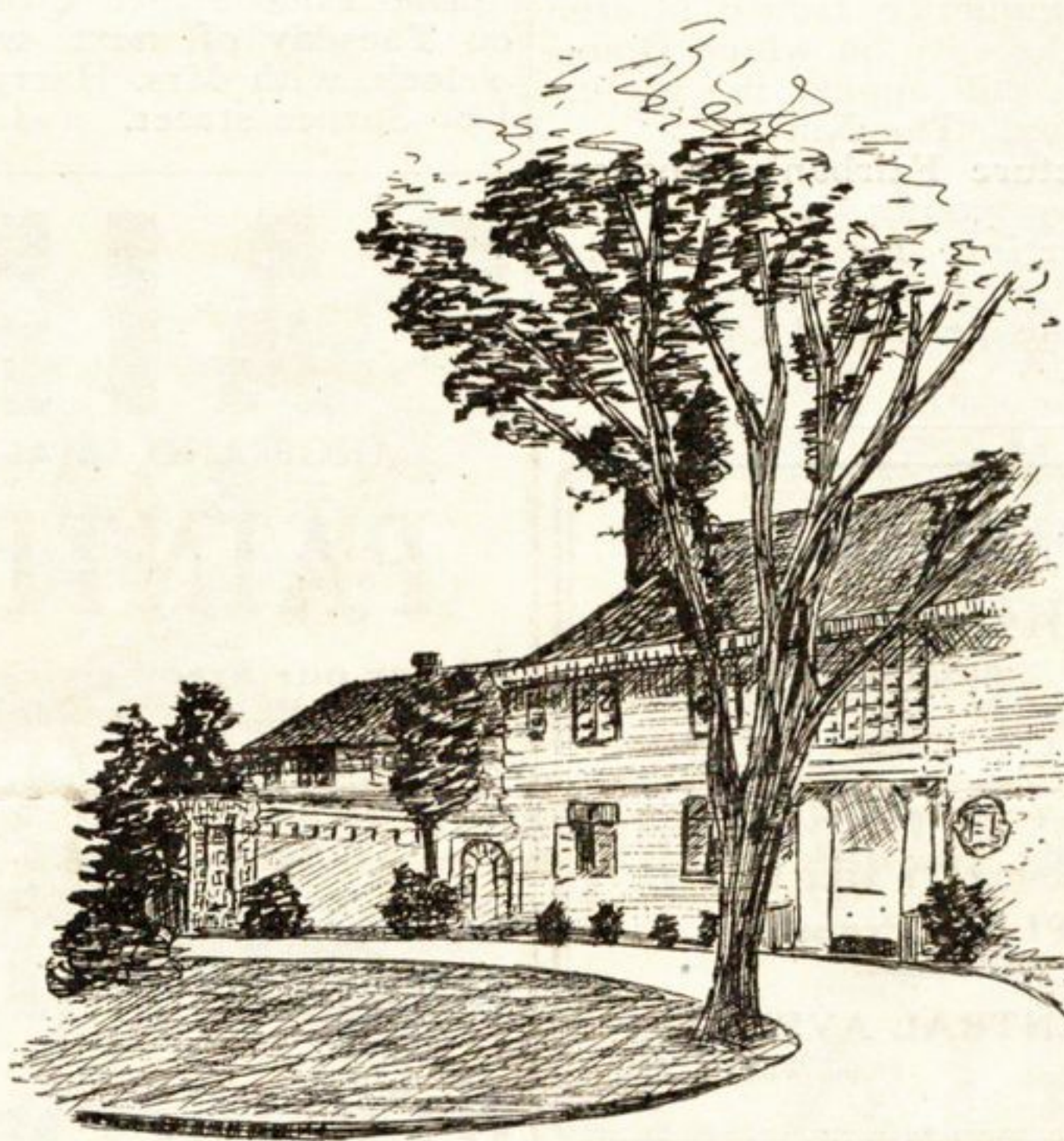
GOLF SPECIAL ADDED TO NORTHWESTERN SCHEDULE
