SAILORS BIGGER EATERS THAN MEN IN U. S. ARMY

Sailors are bigger eaters than soldiers. That's the reason the Senate Naval Affairs committee had to add \$8,000,000 to the House naval appro-

priation bill in the item for rations, bringing the total up to \$29,000,000, instead of the \$21,000,000 approved by the house.

These facts were brought out when a complaint was made to the senate committee that the army paid only 43 cents a man for a ration, whereas the navy was asked 68 cents a man. Naval experts defend the increase on the ground that better and more varied food was required for sea life than on land. The committee looked into the food costs and

finally split the difference, fixing the individual ration at 60 cents.

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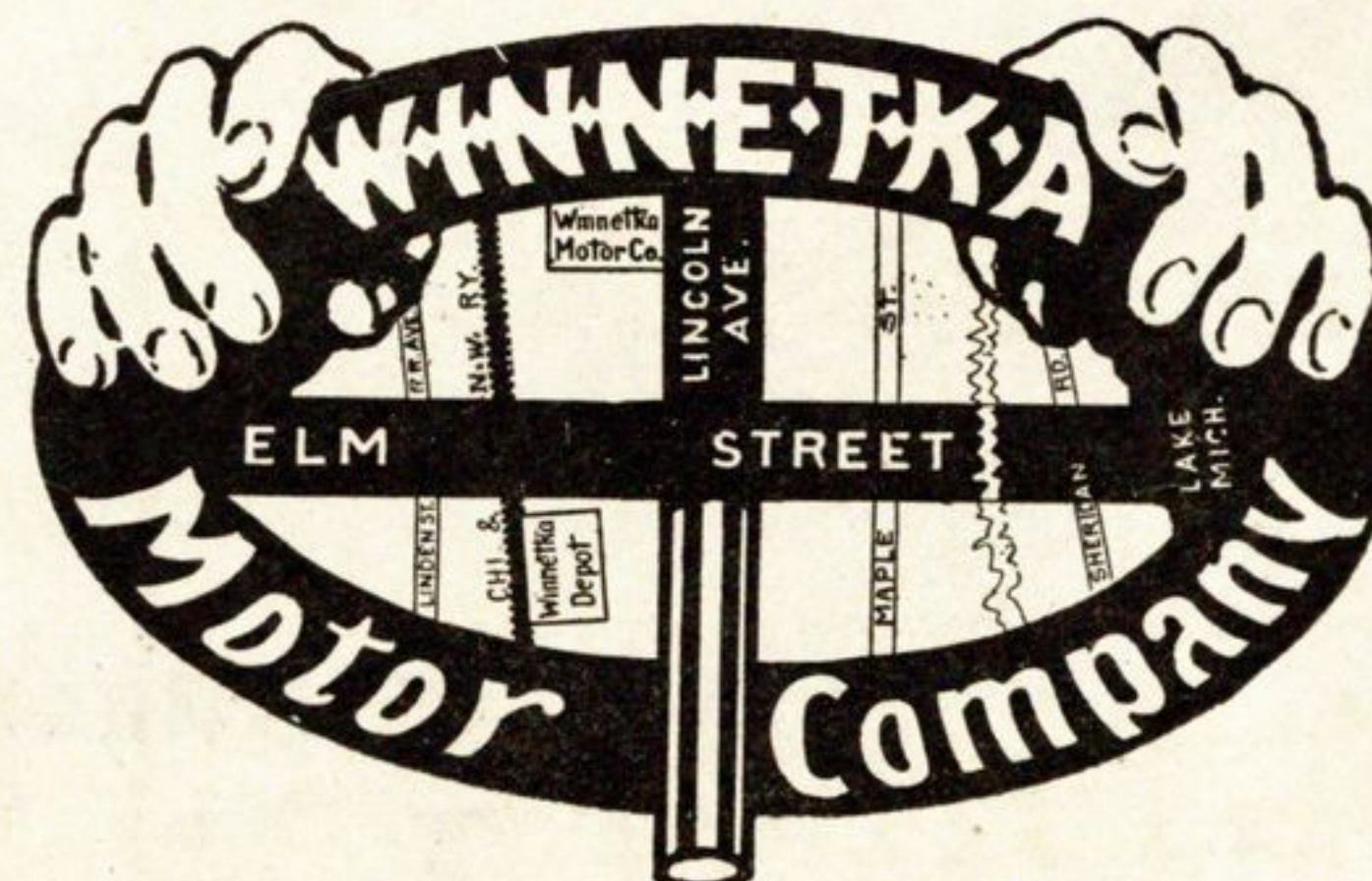
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
