Hatch Silkworms in New Way.

An improvement in the manner of hatching silkworms has been perfected by Japanese growers. Egg cards are immersed in diluted hydrochloric acid for five to ten hours just before they are hatched. In a fortnight or 12 days after the immersion the eggs are perfectly hatched, and worms that are stronger and more healthy than those hatched in any other way may be seen coming out of the shells.

Sane Fourth of July: Stop Fireworks Sales

State Fire Marshal John J. Gambier Issues Order Prohibiting Sales in this Vicinity

No fireworks are to be sold or discharged within the corporate limits of Wilmette, in accordance with an annual notice posted this week by order of Village President Zipf. The sale and discharge of fireworks is prohibited in Wilmette and Kenilworth by ordinance.

The village has also been instrumental in stopping the sale of dangerous and high explosive fireworks in Gross Point and other places in the township in close proximity to the village. An order to that effect was issued this week by State Fire Marshal John J. Gambier, who gave fireworks purveyors five days in which to get their stock "off the shelves" to avoid arrest and prosecution. It was understood the state fire official regarded the sale of fireworks as not only a nuisance but a menace to life and property in the township.

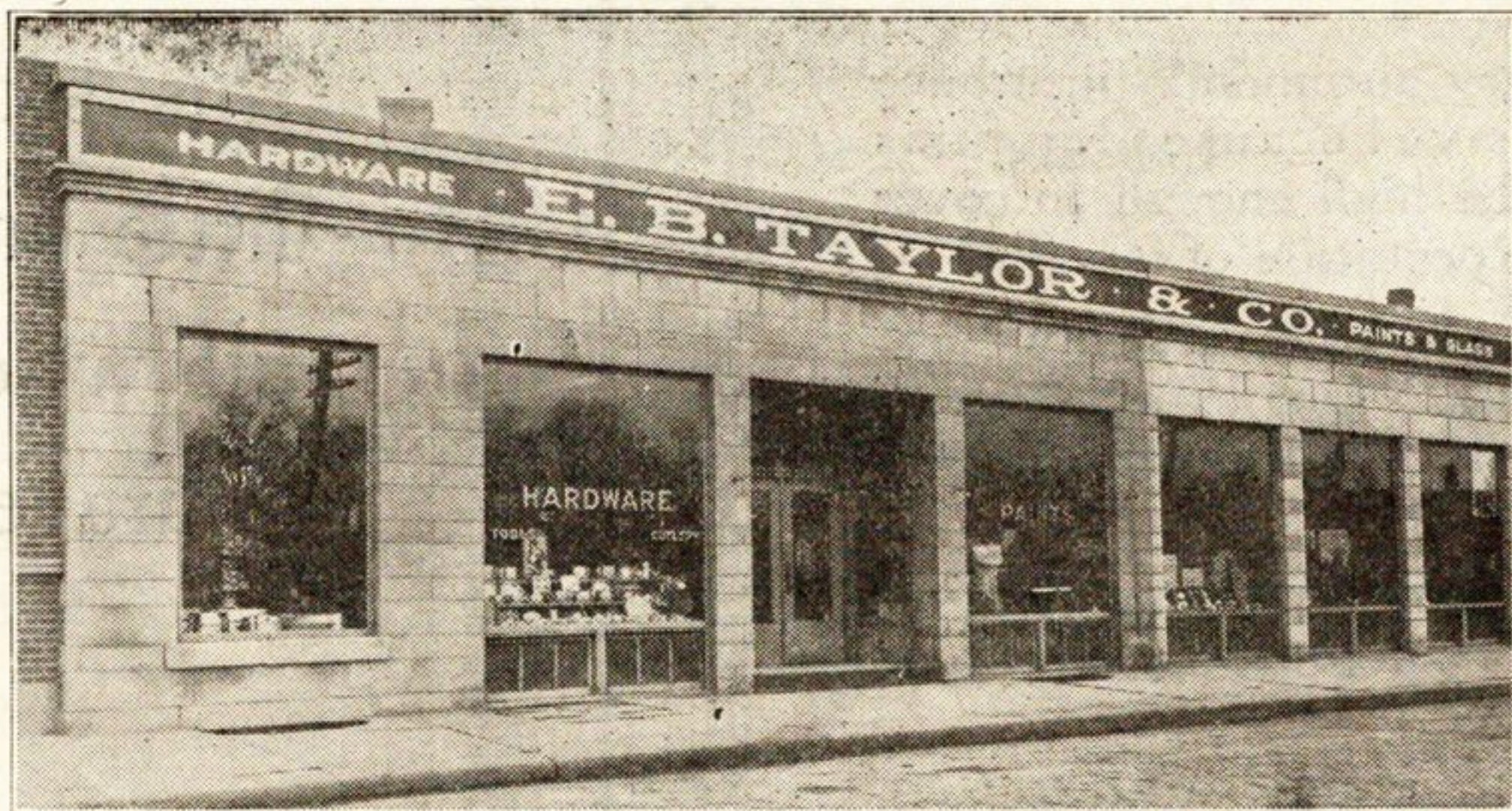
