Mr. and Mrs. Claude Burnham entertained sixteen young people at dinner and the movies in honor of their son, Philip.

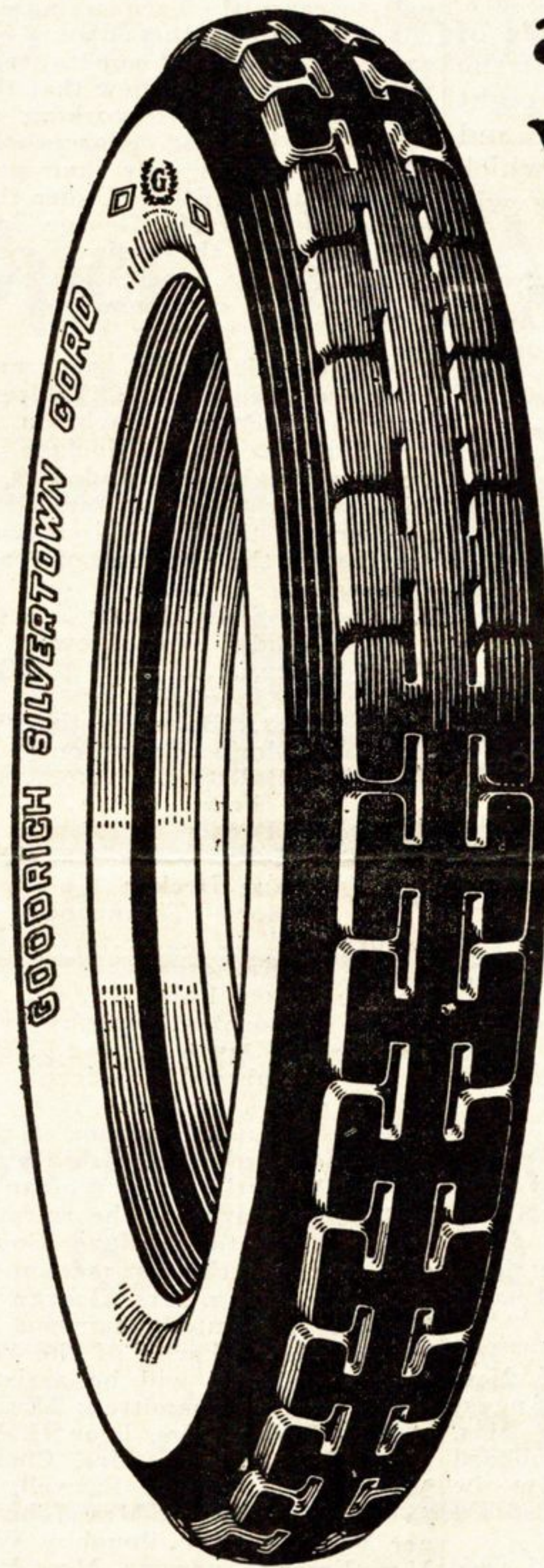
