Wilmette Boy Drowns

Davis Roberts Meets Death After Dive from Sailboat. Girl Companion Swims to Safety

Funeral services for Davis Roberts, who was drowned Saturday morning in Green Lake, Wis., were held at 2:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at the First Congregational church of Wilmette.

Young Roberts who was 19 years old, was the son of Mr. and Mrs. avenue.

and Miss Marion Frost, also of Wilmette, attempted to swim from a sail-boat, almost a mile from shore. They set the sail in the wind before leaving the boat, but the sudden lurch swung it around before the wind and when the pair came to the surface, after their dive, the boat was sailing rapidly away.

Miss Frost was able to overtake the craft and climb aboard, but Roberts became weakened, and drowned before the girl could bring the boat around to pick him up. He went down for the third time when the boat was almost within reach.

The couple were attending a house party at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Pope at Green Lake, given by their son and daughter for a number of young people.

The body of the boy was recovered at 8:30 o'clock Saturday night, before the father, Roscoe L. Roberts arrived at Green Lake.


