

News of the North Shore Golf Clubs by Everett Wilson

WESTMORELAND COUNTRY CLUB will be the host to the Western Amateur Championship from July 11 to 16. This is a very important event and the club is to be considered very fortunate whose grounds are selected for the play. A large and versatile field of players has entered and a very successful tournament is anticipated.

J. W. Douglas scored a three fold victory at Westmoreland when his card of 89-16-73 was tied for low in the qualifying round for the President's trophy and won the sweepstakes as well as the Fellowship cup. The blind bogey resulted in a tie between H. Wilson and W. M. Cromwell each having net totals of 88. J. E. Maass with 94-21-73 tied with Douglas in the elimination round. The third round of the Aberdeen trophy was also decided as follows: N. C. Naylor defeated S. M. Boughton, 1 up; J. D. Archer won from G. A. Eddy, by default; D. W. Bennett defeated J. C. Lytle, 4 and 2; A. C. Boyd defeated F. Burnaby, 4 and 3.

In the morning play Monday the winners of the Blind Bogey event were C. H. Watson, 87; Dr. Corbus, 87; Fred Burnaby, 87; W. M. Jackson, 87. The winners of the Sweepstakes were O. W. Smith, 70; H. V. Conine, 73; W. C. Wilson, 74 and W. B. Huey, 74. C. A. Bush and O. W. Smith were tied with a 13 in the Choice score on 4-8-14-16. R. W. Reid was the winner in the match play against par with 1 up.

In the afternoon-events the winners of the Blind Bogey were: B. C. Corbus, 89; F. M. Boughton, 89; Fred Burnaby, 89 and A. Croxson, 89. The Sweepstakes winners were: H. Heick, 70; Z. F. Harshton, 75; A. Shiverick, 75; W. C. Wilson, 75 and N. C. Naylor, 75. Choice score on 2-6-12-17 won by F. C. Stiles, Jr., with a 19. The Foursome was won by W. B. Huey, J. D. Archer, J. W. McCurdy and W. C. Wilson with a total of 619 for 36 holes. J. W. Douglas was winner of the Independence Day trophy with a score of 224 for 54 holes.

Skokie is starting a little rivalry in the club by means of a "Six Towns Tournament" the qualifying round of which will be held Saturday of this week. There will be six flights of eight players to award the Town Cups. Glencoe, Winnetka, Evanston, Kenilworth, Wilmette, and Hubbard Woods are the six municipalities whose citizens will meet on the links. Some of the players may wish that they lived in some other town when they find that their totals bar them from their own race.

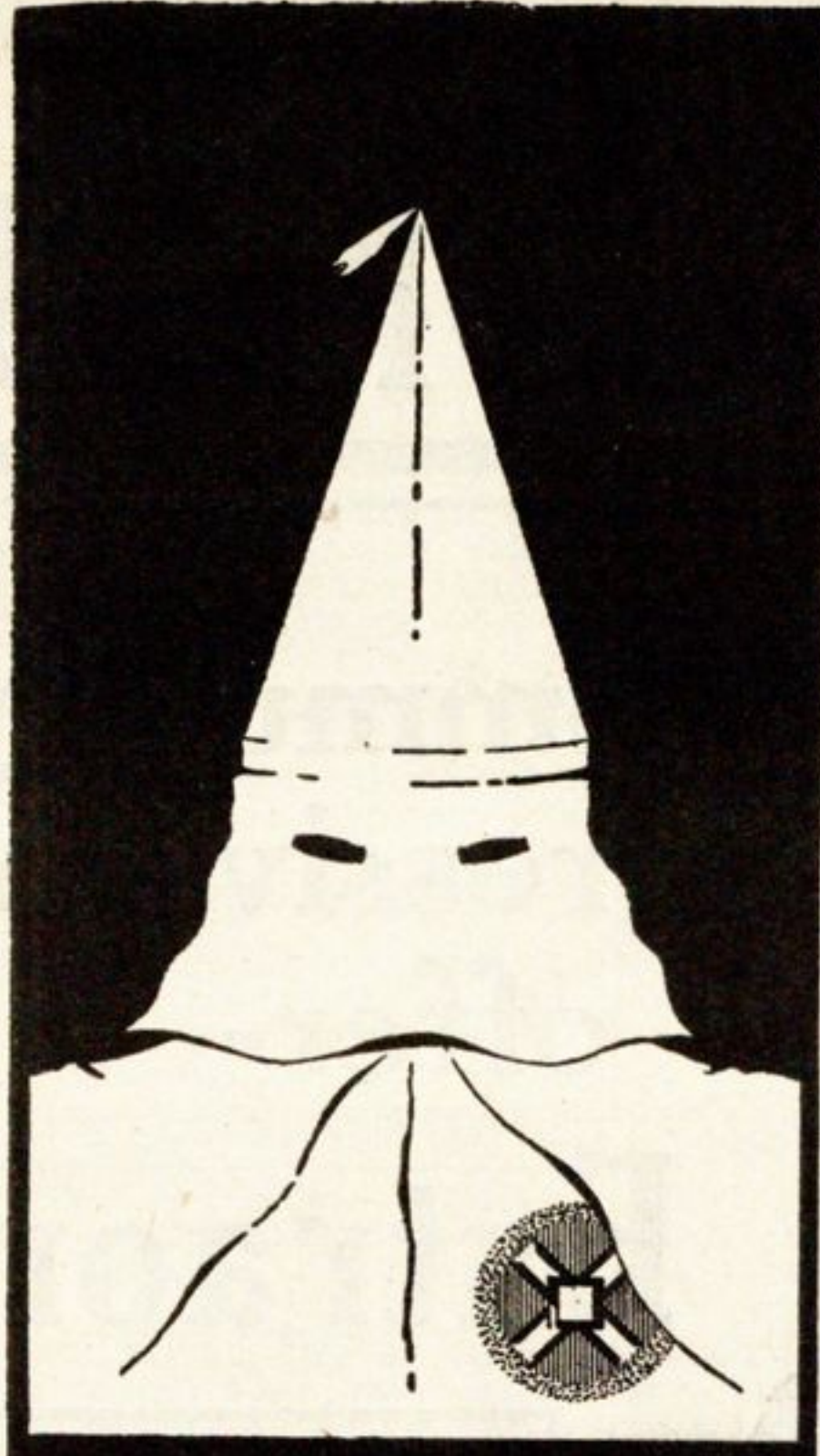

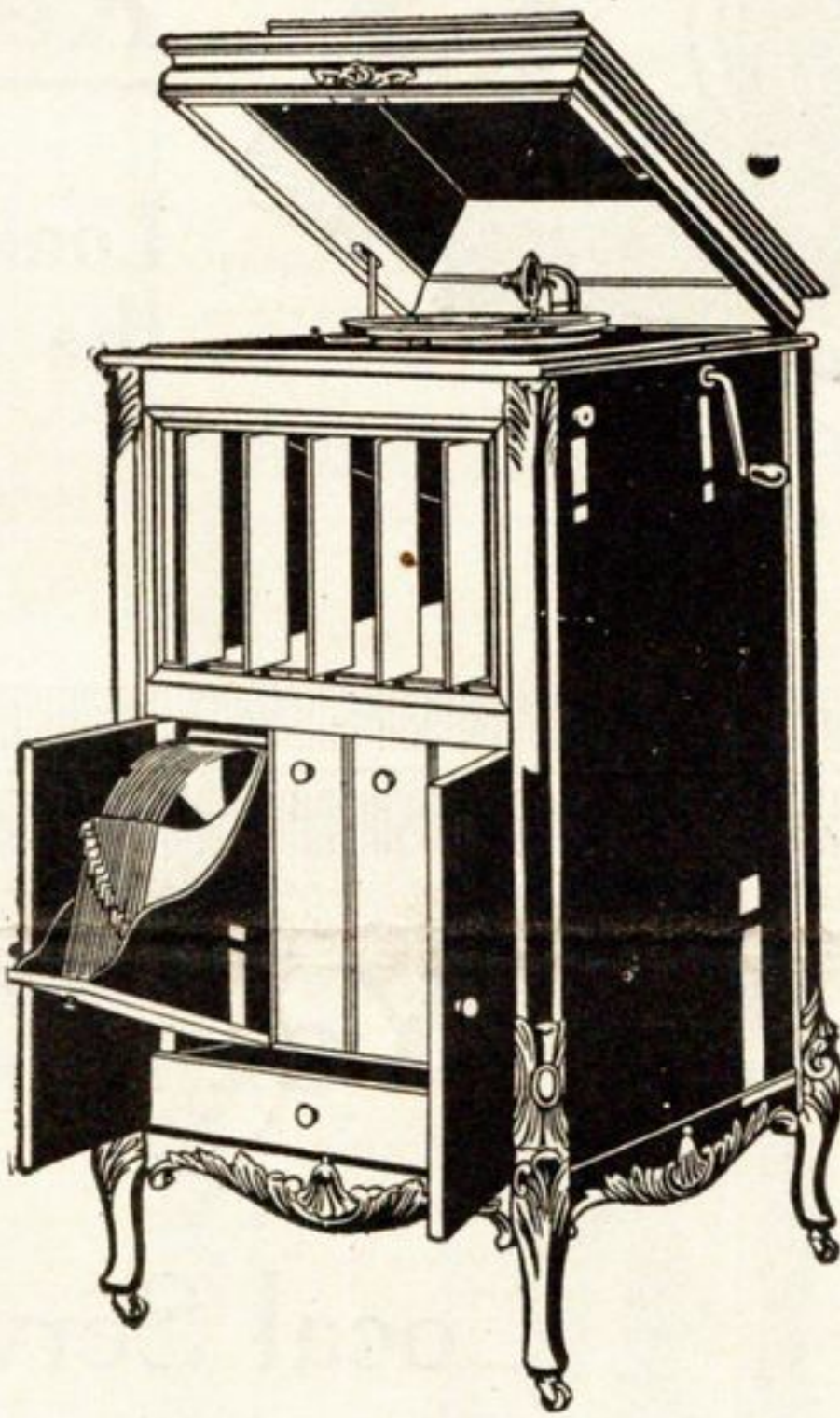
